*Offences.*

4. Any person committing or aiding, abetting or counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order is liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1935.

*Interpretation.*

5. In this Order :—" Sheep " includes lambs.

*Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the Sheep Dipping (Special Regulation) (Northern Ireland) Order of 1944.

*Commencement.*

7. This Order shall come into operation on the date hereof.

**Exported Animals (Compensation) : Suspension of Charges.**

ORDER, DATED THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1944, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE EXPORTED ANIMALS (COMPENSATION) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1928 TO 1938.

1944. No. 102.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry) by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Exported Animals (Compensation) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1928 to 1938 (hereinafter referred to as the Acts) as amended and adapted by any subsequent enactments and of every other power enabling it in that behalf orders, and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

*Suspension of Charges.*

1. The Ministry having been advised by the Trustees appointed for the purposes of the Acts that the Compensation Fund established under the Acts is sufficient to meet all charges which may reasonably be expected to be payable from the Fund during the ensuing six months, and after consultation with the Trustees, suspends the payment by

owners of animals exported to Great Britain from Northern Ireland of the charges required by the Acts as on and from the date hereof until the 1st of November, 1945.

*Short Title.*

2. This Order may be cited as the Exported Animals (Compensation) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1928 to 1938 (Suspension of Charges) Order, 1944.

**BACON INDUSTRY.**

**Pig Nutrition Research Grant.**

ORDER, DATED 6TH NOVEMBER, 1944, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 23 OF THE BACON INDUSTRY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939.

1944. No. 94.

WHEREAS the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") are the Board administering the Pigs Marketing Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") as defined in section twenty-six of the Bacon Industry Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and amended by the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1939; the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1940; and the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1940:

AND WHEREAS paragraph two of the Schedule to the Act provides that any moneys standing to the credit of the fund established by the Scheme which are not required for the operation of the Scheme or otherwise for the purposes of the enactments applicable to the Scheme shall be applied for the benefit of the pig producing industry in such manner as the Ministry of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") may by order direct:

AND WHEREAS by section twenty-three of the Act it is provided that the Ministry may make regulations prescribing anything which is to be prescribed:
