### EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE.

2. The Regulations for Technical Teachers, 1937, (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1937, No. 101) as amended by Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1941, No. 74: 1942, No. 69 ; 1943, No. 24 ; 1944, No. 6 ; and 1944, No. 10, which Regulations as so amended are hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations " are hereby amended as follows :---

Article 5 of Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland 1943. No. 24 is hereby repealed and the following Article substituted therefor :----

5 The War Bonus shall be reckonable for the purposes of the Superannuation Scheme.

4. These Regulations shall come into operation and have effect as from 1st April, 1944, and shall be construed with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.

### EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE.

#### Conveyance.

Order, dated 17th April, 1944, made by the Minister of Home 'AFFAIRS UNDER SECTIONS 37 AND 39 OF THE EXPLOSIVES ACT. 1875. ALTERING THE BYELAWS RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE ÓF DETONATORS AND ELECTRIC DETONATORS WITH OTHER EXPLOSIVE AND TO THE QUANTITY OF EXPLOSIVE WHICH MAY BE CONVEYED IN ANY ONE CARRIAGE.

#### 1944. No. 34.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by sections 37 and 39 of the Explosives Act, 1875 (a), as that Act applies in Northern Ireland, and of every other power in this behalf me thereunto enabling, I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE WILLIAM LOWRY, K.C., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, hereby order that the byelaws made pursuant to the said sections by Order of the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland dated the 10th day of August, 1925 (b), as altered by the Order of the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland dated the 15th day of March, 1940 (c), shall be altered as follows :-

# FACTORIES.

1. The proviso to byelaw 2 of the said byelaws as so altered (which exempts from the requirements of that byelaw the conveyance of detonators and electric detonators in the same carriage or boat with explosive of another Class or Division if the total number of detonators and electric detonators does not exceed 6,000 in all and certain conditions as to packing are complied with) shall have effect as if for the reference therein to 6,000 there were substituted a reference to 10,000.

2. Regulation (p) of the regulations contained in byelaw 4 of the said byelaws (which limits the quantity of certain explosive to be conveyed in any one carriage enclosed on all sides with wood or metal to 4,000 lb.) shall have effect as if for the reference therein to 4,000 lb. there were substituted a reference to 6,000 lb.

### Notification of Diseases.

REGULATIONS, DATED 27th April, 1944, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 70 OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

## 1944. No. 39.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (4) of Section 70 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby applies the provisions of that Section to Toxic Anaemia.

These Regulations may be cited as the Factories (Notification of Diseases) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1944, and shall come into force on the 1st June, 1944.
