

1926, (16 & 17 Geo. V. Chapter 22), and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. The contribution payable by the Council of the County or County Borough in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (3) of Section 3 of the above-mentioned statute, towards the expenses of a youthful offender who has been sent to the Reformatory School pursuant to an Order shall from the first day of April, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-four and until varied by any subsequent Order, be at the rate of Seventeen Shillings (17/-) per week during such time as such youthful offender is detained in the Reformatory School ;

2. Payment of the contribution as aforesaid shall be in arrear, and shall be made half-yearly by the Council of the County or County Borough in respect of the half-years ending 30th September and 31st March, respectively, and shall be made not later than two months from the date of the claim for payment ;

3. The Regulations made by the Ministry of Home Affairs, dated the twenty-fourth day of September, 1943, and approved by the Ministry of Finance on the twenty-ninth day of September in the year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-three are hereby revoked.

### Appointed Day.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED 26TH MAY, 1944, MADE UNDER THE MINISTRIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1944, FIXING AN APPOINTED DAY FOR THE PURPOSES OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS ONE, TWO AND THREE OF THAT ACT.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Ministries Act (Northern Ireland), 1944, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") that on and after the appointed day there shall be established a department which shall be styled by the name of the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland; that the Ministry of Home Affairs shall be the department for the administration, so long as the Ministries Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, continues in force, of the public services administered immediately before the appointed day by the Ministry of Public Security; that as from the appointed day the Ministry of Public Security shall cease to exist and the Minister of Public Security shall cease to hold office; and that in the Act the expression "appointed day" means, in relation to any provision of the Act, such day as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council appoint for the purposes of that provision:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JAMES ALBERT EDWARD, DUKE OF ABERCORN, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Act in this behalf, do hereby order as follows:—

The first day of June, 1944, is hereby fixed to be the appointed day for the purposes of the provisions of the Act hereinbefore recited.
