PART III. GENERAL.

- 6. The amount of additional allowance when payable to a legal personal representative shall be abated by the amount, if any, paid under Article 15 (1) of the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation Scheme, 1925.
 - 7. Subject to the provisions hereof, this Scheme shall apply to-
 - (1) a teacher who comes under the terms of the Teachers' Superannuation (Reciprocal Arrangements) Scheme, 1929, as amended by the Teachers' Superannuation (Reciprocal Arrangements) (Amendment) Scheme, 1935, only in so far as during his service in schools in Northern Ireland he shall have paid contributions under Article 4 of the 1940 Scheme.
 - (2) a pensioner who, at the date of his retirement on pension, came under the provisions of the said Reciprocal Arrangements Schemes.
- 8. The expression "pension" in the Principal Scheme as amended shall be deemed, unless the contrary intention is apparent, to include the additional allowance under this Scheme.
 - 9. (1) In Article 2 of the 1940 Scheme the words "excluding non-contributing service" in line 6 of that Article shall be deleted.
 - (2) Article 9 of the 1940 Scheme (which provided for the postponement of the payment of additional allowances under that Scheme until after the end of the period of the present emergency) is hereby cancelled, and the payments provided for under that Scheme shall be made forthwith.
- 10. This Scheme may be cited as the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1944.

Whereas a Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme") dated the 11th day of March, 1925, was framed by the Ministry of Finance in consultation with the Ministry of Education, in pursuance of Section 70 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1923"), and was approved by Order in Council on the 29th day of May, 1925:

And whereas the Principal Scheme was amended or applied by Amending Schemes dated the 17th day of May, 1926, the 5th day of May, 1927, the 25th day of November, 1929, the 22nd day of February, 1930, the 15th day of October, 1934, the 7th day of September, 1936, the 15th day of October, 1936, the 19th day of July, 1937, the 23rd day of May, 1939, the 31st day of May, 1940, and the 2nd day of May, 1944,

which were approved by Orders in Council on the 29th day of July, 1926, the 31st day of May, 1927, the 27th day of January, 1930, the 6th day of May, 1930, the 14th day of December, 1934, the 23rd day of November, 1936, the 23rd day of November, 1936, the 31st day of August, 1939, the 15th day of August, 1940, and the 26th day of July, 1944, respectively:

AND WHEREAS the Principal Scheme as so amended or applied is hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme as amended":

AND WHEREAS it has been deemed desirable to amend the Principal Scheme as amended in certain particulars:

And whereas the Ministry of Finance in consultation with the Ministry of Education has, in pursuance of Sections 70 and 71 of the Act of 1923, framed a Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Amending Scheme") for amending the Principal Scheme as amended, which Amending Scheme is set out in the Schedule to this Order:

AND WHEREAS the Amending Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament and neither such House has within the period prescribed in that behalf by Section 71 of the Act of 1923, as amended by Section 4 of the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, presented an Address praying the Governor of Northern Ireland to withhold his assent from the Amending Scheme:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 71 of the Act of 1923, do hereby approve of the Amending Scheme.

Given at the Royal Courts of Justice, Belfast, this third day of November, 1944.

SCHEDULE.

In pursuance of Sections 70 and 71 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, the Ministry of Finance in consultation with the Ministry of Education, hereby frames the following scheme for amending the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation Scheme, 1925, as amended or applied by the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1926, the Training College Teachers' Superannuation Scheme, 1927, the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1930, the Teachers' (Miscellaneous) Superannuation Scheme, 1930, the St. Mary's Training College, Belfast, Superannuation Scheme, 1934, the Teachers' (Miscellaneous) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1936, the St. Mary's Training College, Belfast, Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1936, and the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Schemes, 1936, 1937, 1939, 1940 and 1944, and all such schemes are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme as amended".

- 1. This scheme shall apply to teachers who are entitled to have reckoned for pension purposes a period of non-contributing service under Article 3 of the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1930, and who retire on or after the 1st day of April, 1944.
- 2. A teacher to whom this scheme applies shall be entitled to have reckoned in full for pension purposes (but not for the purpose of the additional allowance payable under Article 4 of the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1944), any period of non-contributing service heretofore reckonable at two-thirds of its actual duration under the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1930.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of Article 1 hereof, this scheme shall apply to teachers who come under the terms of the Teachers' Superannuation (Reciprocal Arrangements) Schemes, 1929 and 1935, and to other teachers having non-contributing service who re-enter the Principal Scheme as amended subsequent to the 1st day of April, 1929, only in so far as during their service in schools in Northern Ireland, Article 6 of the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1930, has been applied to them; provided that any non-contributing service of such a teacher in excess of the period for which he has paid supplemental contributions shall be reckoned at two-thirds only of its actual duration.
- 4. This scheme may be cited as the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme (No. 2), 1944.

The Regulations for Technical Teachers, 1937, Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1937, No. 101 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), are hereby amended as follows:—
