Returning Officers' Charges.

REGULATIONS, DATED 24TH MAY, 1945, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION TWENTY-NINE OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918, (7 AND 8 GEO. 5, C. 64), AS APPLIED FOR THE PURPOSES OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF NORTHERN IRELAND, PRESCRIBING THE SCALE OF MAXIMUM CHARGES OF RETURNING OFFICERS AT SUCH ELECTIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by Section Twenty-nine of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, as that Act applied for the purposes of Elections of members of the House of Commons of Northern Ireland, the Ministry hereby prescribes that the Returning Officer shall be entitled, in respect of the conduct of Elections of members to serve in the House of Commons of Northern Ireland for constituencies (other than the University constituency) constituted by the House of Commons (Method of Voting and Redistribution of Seats) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, to his reasonable charges not exceeding the sums hereafter in these Regulations set forth, provided that the charges for disbursements are in no case to exceed the sums actually and necessarily paid or payable.

This scale will be applicable to all elections of such members as aforesaid conducted after the date of these Regulations, and is subject to any alterations which may from time to time be made by any further or other Regulations.

A. — FOR SERVICES OF RETURNING OFFICERS.
I. — IN A CONTESTED ELECTION.

Fee (to include the cost of such legal assistance, if any, as the Returning Officer may determine to employ) for conducting the election and generally performing all the duties which a Returning Officer is required to perform under any enactments relating to Parliamentary Elections—
