3.—Clause (c) of Article 68 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion of the following paragraph after the second paragraph thereof :—

"Where in pursuance of the foregoing provisions of this Clause a woman is appointed as Junior Assistant Mistress and takes up duty as such in a public elementary school for the first time after 31st July, 1945, her recognition may be withdrawn by the Ministry at any time, or may be continued subject to such conditions as the Ministry may from time to time determine."

4.—These Regulations shall be construed with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.

Public Elementary Schools : Teachers' War Service

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH JULY, 1945, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE TEACHERS' SALARIES AND SUPERANNUATION (WAR SERVICE) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1945. No. 94

1.—These regulations may be cited as the Public Elementary School (Teachers' War Service) Regulations, 1940, Amending Regulations, No. 5, 1945.

2.—The Public Elementary School (Teachers' War Service) Regulations, 1940 (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1940, No. 16), as amended by Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1941, No. 45 ; 1942, No. 42 ; 1942, No. 135 ; and 1944, No. 109 ; which Regulations, as so amended, are hereinafter referred to as the "said Regulations", are hereby amended as follows :—

3.—Article 6 of the said Regulations shall have effect as if after paragraph (a) of the said Article there were inserted the following paragraph :—

"(aa) Where a teacher, after return from war service, obtains one of the special qualifications specified in Article 131 of the principal regulations, and can produce evidence, satisfactory to the Ministry, that, prior to undertaking war service, he had already begun a course of study for the qualification, the

Ministry may, if it thinks fit, antedate the award of the premium by such period as, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, it may consider proper : provided that in no case shall the period by which the award of the premium is antedated be greater than the period during which the teacher was absent on war service."

4.—These Regulations shall be construed with and as forming part of the Public Elementary School (Teachers' War Service) Regulations, 1940, and shall take and have effect from the date of those Regulations.

County Court Rules
