THE RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1946, DATED 30TH JULY, 1946, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6. CH. 21).

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (a), dated the 9th day of April, 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Council operates ;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article the provisions relating to statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Schedule hereto shall become effective as from the 5th day of August, 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "the specified date") and accordingly the principal Order shall thereupon have effect subject to the amendments set out in the said Schedule.

(2) Where as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the specified date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the provisions relating to statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Schedule hereto shall, as respects that worker, become effective as from the beginning of the next such period following the specified date.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1946.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

SCHEDULE

PARAGRAPH 1.

The Schedule to the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (S. R. & O. 1946, No. 97), dated 9th April, 1946 (Order N.I.T.R.B. (58)), shall be amended as follows :—

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES.

- (1) The general minimum time rates for male and female workers specified in paragraphs 1 to 4 and in paragraphs 8 to 13 of the said Schedule shall be increased by ten per cent. or 2/- in the £.

PIECE WORK BASIS TIME RATES.

- (2) The piece work basis time rates for male and female workers specified in paragraphs 7 to 12 of the said Schedule shall be increased by ten per cent. or 2/- in the £.

GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE RATES.

- (3) (a) The general minimum piece rates for male and female workers specified in paragraph 14 of the said Schedule shall be increased by ten per cent. or 2/- in the £.
 (b) Paragraph 17 of the said Schedule shall be revoked and a new paragraph inserted as follows :—

FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON THE MAKING OF THE UNDER-MENTIONED GARMENTS IN ESTABLISHMENTS IN WHICH IT IS NOT CUSTOMARY TO REMUNERATE WORKERS ON THE " LOG " SYSTEM OF PAYMENT.

All the piece rates set out in this paragraph are subject to an increase of ten per cent. or 2/- in the £.

17. The general minimum piece rates for male workers employed on the making of the under-mentioned garments in establishments in which it is NOT customary to remunerate workers on the " log " system of payment shall be as follows :—

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.

1. The effect of the Schedule to this Order is to increase, as from 5th August, 1946, the general minimum time rates, piece work basis time rates and general minimum piece rates payable to male and female workers in relation to whom the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates.

2. The provisions of Order N.I.T.R.B. (58) should be read in conjunction with the provisions of this Order.

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the further amendment of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946, (a) dated the 9th day of April, 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.T.R.B. (58)") as amended by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1946, (b) dated the 30th day of July, 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.T.R.B. (60)") which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates ;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :—

1. As from the specified date Order N.I.T.R.B. (58) as amended by Order N.I.T.R.B. (60) shall have effect subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order. Statutory minimum remuneration.

2. In this Order the expression "specified date" means the 5th day of December, 1946. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the specified date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, this Order shall, as respects that worker, become effective as from the beginning of the next such period following the specified date. Commencement.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1946. Short title and interpretation.
