## Brush and Broom Wages Council

THE BRUSH AND BROOM WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1947, DATED 14TH JULY, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 Geo. 6, Ch. 21).

Whereas the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946, dated the 17th day of September, 1946, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates;

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. As from the specified date the Brush and Broom Wages Council Statutory (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946, shall have effect minimum remunerasubject to the amendment set out in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the Commence-16th day of July, 1947. Provided that where, as respects any worker ment. who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
- 3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Brush and Broom Wages Short title Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, and interpretation.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of 12 Geo. 5, this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament Ch. 4. of Northern Ireland.

#### SCHEDULE

#### STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION

Paragraph 1.

The First Schedule to the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946, dated 17th September, 1946 (Order N.I.B.B. (51)) shall be amended as follows:—

There shall be added to paragraph 15 of the First Schedule to the said Order the following proviso—

"Provided that as from the last date on which the said cost of living index figure is published in the *Ministry of Labour Gazette*, this Schedule shall have effect as if the last published figure continued to be published each month in the said *Gazette*."

# Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council

THE DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION ORDER, 1947, DATED 27th February, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 Geo. 6, Ch. 21).

Whereas the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for fixing the minimum remuneration to be paid to certain workers in relation to whom the Council operates in substitution for the minimum remuneration fixed by the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946, dated the 17th day of October, 1946;

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Statutory minimum remuneration. 1. As from the specified date the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1946, (a) shall cease to have effect and the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Schedule to this Order shall be paid to the workers therein specified.

Commence-ment.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 5th day of March 1947 provided that where as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
