County Down, in respect of research in pig nutrition, and such payment shall be made within two months from the date of commencement of this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Bacon Industry (Pig Nutrition Research Grant) Order (Northern Ireland), 1947, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

REGULATIONS, DATED THE FOURTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION 54 OF THE REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS (IRELAND) ACT, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 2 OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

The Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 54 of the Registration of Births and Deaths (Ireland) Act, as amended by Section 2 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. The sum payable to a Registrar in respect of the registration of births and deaths during a period of account (as defined by these Regulations) shall be calculated as follows:—
 - (a) for each of the first twenty-five registrations, five shillings;
 - (b) for each of the next five hundred registrations, two shillings;
 - (c) for each registration subsequent to the first five hundred and twenty-five, one shilling.
- 2. Where, by reason of a vacancy in the office of a Registrar, the duties of that office are during any period of account performed by two or more persons authorised to discharge such duties, the total sum payable shall be apportioned between those persons according to the number of registrations carried out by each.

- 3. For the purposes of these regulations, there shall in each year be four periods of account being the quarters ending respectively on the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September and the thirty-first day of December.
- 4. These regulations may be cited as the Registration of Births and Deaths (Payment of Registrars) Regulations, 1947, and shall have effect as regards all accounts verified and signed by Superintendent Registrars on or after the 1st day of October, 1947.

The Registrar-General for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 34 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act (Ireland), 1880, as extended by Section 1 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, with the consent of the Governor of Northern Ireland, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. A certificate of birth issued under Section 1 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (hereinafter referred to as a "short birth certificate") shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule to these Regulations.:

Provided that where the short birth certificate relates to a person who was adopted under the Adoption of Children Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, the words "place of birth" shall be omitted.

- 2. A short birth certificate issued by the Registrar-General shall be authenticated by the Seal of the General Register Office, and a short birth certificate issued by a Superintendent Registrar or Registrar shall be authenticated by the signature of the issuing officer.
- 3. Where a short birth certificate is to be issued from an entry of birth, the application therefor shall contain the following particulars:—
