The Poultry Diseases Order (Northern Ireland), 1947

Order, dated 24th February, 1947, made by the Ministry of Agriculture under the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland), 1894 to 1935.

1947. No. 28

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Diseases of Animals Acts

(Northern Ireland), 1894 to 1935, as amended and adapted by any other enactments and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Extension of Definition of Animals

1. For the purposes of Section 22 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Act") the definition of "animals" contained in Section 59 (I) of the principal Act shall be extended so that the same shall for those purposes comprise poultry.

Definition

2. "Poultry" for the purposes of this Order means live poultry of the following kinds:—domestic fowls and turkeys.

Extension of Definition of Disease

3. For the purpose of Section 22 of the principal Act, as applied by Article I above to poultry, the definition of "disease" contained in Section 59 (I) of the principal Act shall mean Bacillary White Diarrhæa and Fowl Typhoid.

Importation of (1) Poultry and (2) Eggs for Hatching

4. On and after the date of the coming into operation of this Order a person shall not land, or attempt to land, in Northern Ireland, any poultry or any eggs for hatching, or any eggs which in the opinion of the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the "Ministry") are intended for hatching unless he shall have previously obtained from the Ministry a Permit authorising such landing.

Permits for Landing of Live Poultry and Eggs for Hatching from Great Britain

- 5.—(i) In any case of landing from Great Britain of live poultry which are less than four months old when landed, of eggs for hatching, or of any eggs which, in the opinion of the Ministry, are intended for hatching, application to the Ministry for a Permit shall be accompanied by
 - (a) a certificate from the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries as regards importations from England and Wales, or from the Department of Agriculture for Scotland as regards importations from Scotland, to the effect that the flocks from which the birds or eggs were produced had been tested in accordance with the Regulations contained in the Accredited Poultry Breeding Stations Scheme of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, or the Accredited Poultry Breeding Stations Scheme and the Scheme for the Distribution of Eggs and Poultry

- from the Distributing Stations approved by the Department of Agriculture for Scotland, as the case may be, and had been found to be free from Bacillary White Diarrhœa and Fowl Typhoid;
- (b) a declaration in the form required by the Ministry from the owner of the flocks from which the birds or eggs were produced, to the effect that those flocks are free from Bacillary White Diarrhea and Fowl Typhoid; and
- (c) such other evidence, if any, as the Ministry may require in regard to the health of the aforesaid flocks.
- (ii) In any case of landing from Great Britain of live poultry which are four months old or more when landed, a Permit will be issued subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) the poultry shall be landed only at the port of Belfast;
 - (b) on arrival at the port of Belfast the poultry shall be taken direct to such premises as the Ministry may designate;
 - (c) on arrival at the premises mentioned in (b) immediately preceding, the poultry shall be tested by the Ministry for Bacillary White Diarrhæa and Fowl Typhoid;
 - (d) any bird which re-acts to the aforesaid test may, at the Ministry's discretion, be returned to the person from whom imported, or disposed of in such manner as the Ministry thinks fit; and
 - (e) poultry which do not re-act to the test shall then be moved to the importer's premises in Northern Ireland and shall there be subject to such isolation and for such period, if any, as the Ministry may direct.

Permits for Landing of Live Poultry and Eggs for Hatching from countries other than Great Britain

- 6.—(i) In any case of landing from any country other than Great Britain of live poultry which are less than four months old when landed, of eggs for hatching, or of any eggs which, in the opinion of the Ministry, are intended for hatching, application to the Ministry for a Permit shall be accompanied by:—
 - (a) a certificate from the appropriate Authority recognised by the Ministry in the exporting country, to the effect that the flocks from which the poultry or eggs originated are free from Bacillary White Diarrhæa and Fowl Typhoid;
 - (b) a declaration in the form required by the Ministry by the person from whom the poultry or eggs are to be imported to the effect that the flocks from which the poultry or

- eggs originated are free from Bacillary White Diarrhœa and Fowl Typhoid; and
- (c) such other evidence, if any, as the Ministry may require in regard to the health of the flocks from which the poultry or eggs originated.
- (ii) In any case of landing from any country other than Great Britain of live poultry which are four months old or more when landed, a Permit will be issued subject to any or all of the following conditions as the Ministry may impose:
 - (a) a declaration shall be furnished in the form required by the Ministry by the owner of the flocks from which the poultry were produced to the effect that those flocks are free from Bacillary White Diarrhæa and Fowl Typhoid;
 - (b) the poultry shall be landed only at the port of Belfast;
 - (c) on arrival at the port of Belfast the poultry shall be taken direct to such premises as the Ministry may designate;
 - (d) on arrival at the premises mentioned in (c) immediately preceding, the poultry shall be tested by the Ministry for Bacillary White Diarrhea and Fowl Typhoid;
 - (e) any bird which re-acts to the aforesaid test may, at the Ministry's discretion, be returned to the person from whom imported, or disposed of in such manner as the Ministry thinks fit; and
 - (f) poultry which do not re-act to the test shall then be moved to the importer's premises in Northern Ireland and shall there be subject to such isolation and for such period, if any, as the Ministry may direct.

Permits in Special Cases

7. The Ministry may, on such conditions as it deems fit, issue special permits for the landing of poultry coming direct to a recognised Show or Exhibition in Northern Ireland, or for the landing of poultry sent by Northern Ireland exhibitors to a recognised Show or Exhibition outside Northern Ireland and being returned direct to Northern Ireland.

Ministry's Liability

8. No liability, financial or otherwise, shall attach to the Ministry in connection with any poultry or eggs dealt with in any manner under the provisions of this Order.

Offences

9. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland), 1894 to 1935.

Commencement

- 10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.
- 11. The Poultry Diseases Order (Northern Ireland), 1933, is hereby revoked.

Short Title

12. This Order may be cited as the Poultry Diseases Order (Northern Ireland), 1947.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland), 1894 to 1935, as amended and adapted by any other enactments and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- Extension of 1894, (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Act") the definition of of Animals. "animals" contained in Section 59 (1) of the principal Act shall be extended so that the same shall for those purposes comprise poultry.
- Definition.

 2. "Poultry" for the purposes of this Order means live poultry of the following kinds:—domestic fowls, turkeys, geese, ducks, guinea fowls, pigeons, pheasants and partridges.
- Import of Poultry and Eggs.

 3. A person shall not bring, or cause to be brought, into Northern Ireland poultry or eggs for hatching except under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence issued by the Ministry or a duly authorised officer thereof.
- Issue of Licences.

 4. Where, on an application for a licence under the last foregoing article, a person satisfies the Ministry that the issue of such a licence to him—
