2. For sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 1 of the Second Schedule to the National Fire Service (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1942 (f), (which relates to the pay of whole-time firemen and firewomen), there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph :—

“(2) The rate of pay for whole-time firemen or firewomen holding a rank set out in the sub-joined table shall be the amount set opposite to that rank :—

REGULATIONS, DATED the 22ND DAY OF MARCH, 1947, MADE BY THE  
MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SUB-  
SECTION (1) OF SECTION ONE OF THE FIRE SERVICES (EMERGENCY  
PROVISIONS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1942.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Sub-section (1) of Section One of the Fire Services (Emergency Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1942, and by the Ministries (Transfer of Functions) (No. 1) Order, 1944, and by the Fire Services (Emergency Provisions) (Amendment) Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the National Fire Service (General) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. After paragraph (4) of Regulation 9 of the National Fire Service (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1942, (which Regulation relates to the suspension of the obligations of local authorities), there shall be inserted the following paragraph :—

“(5) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Regulation, it shall be lawful for a local authority to levy a rate for the local financial year beginning on the 1st day of April, 1947, for the purpose of making provision for the extinction of fires and the protection of life and property in case of fire, as though this Regulation had not been made.”

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH JUNE, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER THE NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, acting in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 66 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations :—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the National Insurance (Approved Societies) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them—
