1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Secondary Schools (Payment of Grants) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) In these Regulations the expression “ the principal Regulations ” means the Secondary School Grants Regulations, 1935, as amended by subsequent Regulations other than these Regulations.

(3) These Regulations shall be construed as one with the principal Regulations.

2. In the case of a school which is under the management of a local education authority :—

(a) no grant shall be payable by the Ministry to the governing body in respect of the attendances of pupils during the period 1st April to 31st July, 1948.

(b) the grant in respect of the attendances of pupils during the period commencing 1st August, 1947, and ending 31st March, 1948, shall be an amount equivalent to two-thirds of the sum which would have been paid in accordance with the provisions of the principal Regulations in respect of the school year ending 31st July, 1948, if this Regulation had not come into operation.

Public Elementary Schools : Salaries and Allowances

REGULATIONS, DATED 5TH JUNE, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 TO 1942, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1947. No. 93

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as “ the Ministry ”) in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 65, 69 and 99 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Elementary Schools (Salaries and Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) In these Regulations the expression “the Principal Regulations” means the Public Elementary Schools (Salaries and Allowances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1946.

(3) These Regulations shall be construed as one with the Principal Regulations, and shall have effect as from the date upon which those Regulations took effect.

2.—Notwithstanding anything contained in the Principal Regulations or in the Regulations for Public Elementary Schools, a teacher who on 31st March, 1945, was recognised as 1st Vice-Principal in a school, and who, if the regulations then in force had continued in operation, would have been entitled to continued recognition in that capacity in the same school shall, so long as he continues to fulfil the conditions necessary for recognition as a Vice-Principal and to serve in that school, continue to be recognised as Vice-Principal and to receive, if greater than the amount of any Vice-Principal’s allowance to which he may be entitled under the Regulations in force since 31st March, 1945, and in lieu thereof, the Annual Capitation Grant to which he would have been entitled under the Regulations in force on 31st March, 1945, for so long as he would have been entitled thereto under those Regulations, if they had remained in force : provided that the annual rate of such Grant shall not exceed £35.

3.—(1) For the scales of salaries and allowances to teachers in special schools prescribed by the Regulations for Public Elementary Schools and the conditions prescribed by those Regulations for admission to such scales of salaries and for the granting of such allowances there shall be substituted respectively the scales of salaries and allowances and the conditions prescribed by the following provisions of these Regulations:

(2) Full-time principal and assistant teachers in special schools who hold qualifications which would entitle them to recognition as qualified principal or assistant teachers, as the case may be, in public elementary or secondary schools in Northern Ireland shall receive salary (and allowances, other than, in the case of principal teachers, Principal’s Allowance) in accordance with the scales on which salary (and allowances, other than, in the case of principal teachers, Principal’s Allowance) would be payable if they were serving as full-time principal or assistant teachers, as the case may be, in public elementary schools.

(3) (i) Existing full-time principal and assistant teachers in special schools who do not hold qualifications which would entitle them to recognition as qualified principal or assistant teachers, as the case may be, in public elementary or secondary schools in Northern Ireland

but who have received salary in accordance with the scales in force up to 31st March, 1945, for trained teachers in public elementary schools shall be placed on scale I of the salary scales prescribed for full-time qualified teachers in public elementary schools with credit for years of service equal to the number of increments awarded to them on the said scales for trained teachers in public elementary schools.

- (ii) For the purpose of this Regulation an "existing" teacher means a teacher who was serving as such in a Special School on 31st March, 1945, or, if not serving on that date, who was temporarily out of the service on that date.

(4) Principal and assistant teachers in special schools shall, in addition to the salary and allowances payable in accordance with paragraphs (2) and (3) hereof, receive a "special schools allowance" the amount of which shall be determined by the class in which the school is placed. The annual rate of the special schools allowance for teachers in Class A schools shall be an amount equal to three increments of the salary scale on which the teacher receives salary; in Class B schools, two such increments, and in Class C schools, one such increment.

The Class in which a special school shall be placed shall be determined by the Ministry.

- (5) (i) Principal teachers of special schools shall, in addition to the salary and allowances payable in accordance with the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs hereof, receive a Principal's Allowance at the following rates:—

For schools with an average daily enrolment of:—

Up to 30 pupils	£35 per annum
From 31 to 70 pupils	£60 "
" 71 to 120	"	...	£100 "
" 121 to 200	"	...	£150 "
Over 200	"	...	£200 "

- (ii) The rate of Principal's Allowance payable to the principal teacher of a special school shall be determined, save as modified by sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph, in the same manner as in the case of a principal teacher of a public elementary school.

4.—For the purpose of these Regulations a school certified by the Ministry for afflicted children under Part IX of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, or a school for children who, though not afflicted children as defined in the said Act, suffer from physical disability of a kind which makes the provision of a special school desirable, shall be deemed to be a "special school".

5.—So much of the Regulations for public elementary schools as requires the payment of war bonus to any teacher to whom these Regulations apply shall cease to have effect.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED THE 24TH JUNE, 1947, APPROVING TEACHERS' SUPERANNUATION SCHEME FRAMED BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTIONS 70 AND 71 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

WHEREAS a Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme") dated the 17th day of May, 1926, was framed by the Ministry of Finance in consultation with the Ministry of Education, in pursuance of Section 70 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1923"), and was approved by Order in Council on the 29th day of July, 1926 :

AND WHEREAS the Principal Scheme was amended by Amending Schemes dated the 26th day of April, 1927, the 21st day of July, 1927, the 5th day of December, 1929, the 15th day of October, 1936, the 14th day of March, 1939, the 31st day of May, 1940, the 4th day of April, 1944, and the 18th day of July, 1944, which were approved by Orders in Council on the 19th day of May, 1927, the 20th day of December, 1927, the 27th day of January, 1930, the 23rd day of November, 1936, the 26th day of May, 1939, the 15th day of August, 1940, the 26th day of May, 1944, and the 3rd day of November, 1944, respectively :

AND WHEREAS the Principal Scheme as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme as amended" :

AND WHEREAS it has been deemed desirable to amend the Principal Scheme as amended in certain particulars :

AND WHEREAS the Ministry of Finance in consultation with the Ministry of Education has, in pursuance of Sections 70 and 71 of the
