

for the purposes of the enactments applicable to the Scheme shall be applied for the benefit of the pig producing industry in such manner as the Ministry of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") may by order direct :

AND WHEREAS by section twenty-three of the Act it is provided that the Ministry may make regulations prescribing anything which is to be prescribed :

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said Schedule and section of the Act and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order, that is to say :—

1. The Board shall, in respect of the period 1st March, 1948, to 28th February, 1949, pay the sum of £400 to the Trustees of the Agricultural Research Institute of Northern Ireland, Hillsborough, County Down, in respect of research in pig husbandry, and such payment shall be made within two months from the date of commencement of this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Bacon Industry (Pig Husbandry Research Grant) Order (Northern Ireland), 1948 and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

## BEE PESTS AND DISEASES

### **Bee Pest Prevention Amendment (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1948.**

REGULATIONS DATED 11TH MAY, 1948, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE BEE PEST PREVENTION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945, (8 AND 9 GEO. VI., C.1.)

1948. No. 121

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Bee Pest Prevention Act (Northern Ireland) 1945, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations by way of amendment of the Bee Pest Prevention (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1945, (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) :—

1. For Article 11 (4) (a) there shall be substituted

(a) Movable-comb hive

BEES :— For each frame of comb fully covered with live bees ten shillings, subject to a maximum of eighty shillings.

For each frame of comb not fully covered with live bees such lesser sum as is reasonably proportionate to the area of the frame which in the opinion of the authorised officer is covered with live bees.

APPLIANCES :—Frames, eightpence each.

Sections, threepence halfpenny each.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the eleventh day of May, 1948.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1948, and shall be construed as one with the principal Regulations and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Bee Pest Prevention (Revised) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1948.

1. For Article 2 there shall be substituted —

The following are hereby specified as the pests and diseases to which the Act and these Regulations shall apply, viz. :

American Foul Brood ;

European Foul Brood ;

Acarine (Isle of Wight) Disease, and

Nosema Disease.
