Compulsory School Age (Postponement)

Order, dated 1st January, 1948, made by the Ministry of Education under section 109 (3) of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947.

1948. No. 2

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by sub-section (3) of section 109 of the Education Act, (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders as follows :—

1. While this Order remains in force, section thirty-three of the said Act (which defines the expression " compulsory school age " as meaning any age between five years and fifteen years) shall have effect as if for references therein to fifteen there were substituted references to fourteen.

2. Subject to the proviso to the said sub-section (3) (which provides that if any order under the said sub-section is still in operation on the first day of April, 1951, the order shall then cease to have effect), this Order shall expire with such date as may hereafter be specified by further Order of the Ministry.

3. This Order may be cited as the Compulsory School Age (Postponement) Order (Northern Ireland), 1948.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of section seven of the Education (Evacuated Children) Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that the Act shall continue in force until such date as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council declare to be the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Act came to an end, and shall then expire except as respects things previously done or omitted to be done :

Now, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM SPENCER, EARL GRANVILLE, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Vive-Admiral, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by sub-section (3) of section seven of the Act, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Education (Evacuated Children) Act (End of Emergency) Order (Northern Ireland), 1948.

2. It is hereby declared that the twenty-seventh day of June nineteen hundred and forty-eight is the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Act came to an end.
