

REGULATIONS, DATED 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1948, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.

The Ministry of Commerce in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 8 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, and of all other powers in this behalf thereunto enabling it hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Newcastle, County Down) Regulations, 1948.

2. Every vehicle entering any street or length of street in the Urban District of Newcastle in the County of Down specified in the Schedule to these Regulations shall follow the direction prescribed in relation to that street in the Schedule.

URBAN DISTRICT OF NEWCASTLE

<i>Length of Street</i>	<i>Direction</i>
Railway Street between its junction with Castlewellan Road and Main Street.	From North-West to South-East
Main Street between its junction with Railway Street and Castlewellan Road and Bryansford Avenue.	From North to South.
Castlewellan Road between its junction with Bryansford Avenue and Main Street and Railway Street.	From South to North.
