Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938.
(Extension of Section 87).

REGULATIONS, DATED 3RD JULY, 1948, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 87 (7) OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

1948. No. 183

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Section 87 (7) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, (a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, (Extension of Section 87) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948, and shall come into force on the 28th day of July, 1948.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (b) shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2. Glass works, which are included in Article 2 of Part II of the Schedule to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, are hereby specified for the purposes of Section 87 of the Act.

ORDER DATED 27th SEPTEMBER, 1948, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1938.

1948. No. 277

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Factories

(a) 2 Geo 6, C. 23.

(b) 52 and 53 Vict. C. 63.

Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Factories (Forms and Particulars) Order (Northern Ireland), 1948.

2. In this Order the expression “ the Act ” means the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938.

3. The Abstract of the Act which is required by Sections 109 ^{Form N.I. 2.} (1)(g) and 120 (1) of the Act to be kept posted at the principal entrances of a dock, wharf, quay or warehouse at which employed persons enter shall be in the form N.I. 2 set out in the Schedule to this Order.

4. The Abstract of the Act which is required by Sections 111 ^{Form N.I. 3.} (1)(f), 112 (1)(f) and 120 (1) of the Act to be kept posted at the principal entrances of a building operation or work of engineering construction at which employed persons enter shall be in the form N.I. 3, set out in the Schedule to this Order.

5. The register which is required by Section 122 (1) of the Act to be kept in every factory shall be in the form N.I. 31, set out in ^{Form} the Schedule to this Order and the particulars required by the said ^{N.I. 31.} Section to be entered in or attached to the register shall be those contained in the said form.

6. The notice of exceptional overtime in fruit or vegetable ^{Form} preserving factories which is required under Regulation 6 of the ^{N.I. 29.} Factories (Fruit and Vegetable Preserving—Hours of Women and Young Persons) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1946, shall be in the form N.I. 29, set out in the Schedule to this Order.

7. The register of women and young persons which is required ^{Form} to be kept by Regulation 7 of the Factories (Fruit and Vegetable ^{N.I. 40.} Preserving—Hours of Women and Young Persons) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1946, shall be in the form N.I. 40 set out in the Schedule to this Order.

8. So much of the Factories (Forms and Particulars) Order (Northern Ireland), 1939 (a), as deals with the Abstracts of the Act, Forms N.I. 2 and N.I. 3, and the Register, Form N.I. 31, is hereby revoked.
