THE PORT SANITARY (REVOCATION) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948, DATED 31ST JANUARY, 1948, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1878 TO 1946, AND SECTION ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-THREE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1936.

The Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Public Health Acts (Northern Ireland), 1878 to 1946 and section one hundred and fortythree of the Public Health Act, 1936, as extended to Northern Ireland and adapted by the Public Health (Northern Ireland) (Extension of Enactments) Order, 1939, (a) and the Ministries of Northern Ireland (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1945 (b) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations, with the consent so far as they apply to signals in the case of vessels of the Minister of Transport and, with the consent so far as they apply to officers of customs and excise, of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise:-

- These regulations may be cited as the Port Sanitary (Revocation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948, and shall come into force on the first day of March, 1948.
- The Port Sanitary Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1946 (c) are hereby revoked.
