Death Certificates

REGULATIONS, DATED 21ST JUNE, 1949, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER PARAGRAPH 5 OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE TO THE INDUSTRIAL ASSURANCE AND FRIENDLY SOCIETIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948.

The Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by paragraph 5 of the First Schedule to the Industrial Assurance and Friendly Societies Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Industrial Assurance and Friendly Societies (Death Certificates) Regulations, (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall come into operation on the 5th day of July, 1949.

2.—(1) In these regulations —

“ the Act ” means the Industrial Assurance and Friendly Societies Act (Northern Ireland), 1948 ;

“ death certificate ” means a certificate of a death issued for the purposes of the First Schedule to the Act ;

“ the Registrar-General ” means the Registrar-General for Northern Ireland ;

“ registration officer ” in relation to a death certificate or an application therefor, means the superintendent registrar or registrar of births and deaths having the custody for the time being of the register book in which the death to which the certificate or application relates is entered.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

3.—(1) An application for a death certificate shall be made to the registration officer on a form provided for the purpose by the Registrar-General.

(2) A registration officer shall not issue a death certificate to an applicant unless the applicant certifies on the application that he is the child, stepchild or grandchild of the person to whose death the application relates, or has been adopted by that person under the provisions of the Adoption of Children Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, and that he is entitled to claim under an insurance taken out by him on or after the 1st day of January, 1925, on the life of that person.

(3) A death certificate shall be issued on a form provided for the purpose by the Registrar-General.

4. Except as in the next following regulation provided, a registration officer shall not issue more than one death certificate of the same death to the same person ; and accordingly he shall, before issuing a death certificate, inspect the counterfoils of all death certificates issued by him since the date of the death to which the application relates.

5.—(1) If a person to whom a death certificate has been issued makes and delivers to the registration officer a statutory declaration stating that the certificate has been lost or destroyed, and stating whether any indorsement had been made on the certificate, and, if so, by what society or company, the registration officer shall issue to the person, on a form provided for the purpose by the Registrar-General, a duplicate of the certificate.

(2) A registration officer, in issuing a duplicate certificate under this regulation in a case where it appears from the statutory declaration furnished as aforesaid that an indorsement had been made on the lost or destroyed certificate by any society or company, shall record on the duplicate a requirement that it is to be produced to that society or company in order to have the indorsement repeated on the duplicate.

(3) It shall be the duty of a person who recovers a death certificate, a duplicate of which has been issued to him under this regulation, to surrender the certificate so recovered to the registration officer for destruction.

6. The fee payable to a registration officer on the issue of a death certificate or a duplicate certificate shall be two shillings and sixpence. A search fee of one shilling shall also be payable in any case where the

certificate is not obtained at the time of registration of the death unless the applicant can supply such particulars as will enable the entry to be found without a search.

WHEREAS the application of the provisions of section one, sub-section (1) of section two and sub-section (1) of section six of the Industrial Assurance and Friendly Societies Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, is limited to insurances where the funeral expenses in question are those, or the life or death in question is that, of a person who at the time of the proposal is ordinarily resident in Northern Ireland :

AND WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (1) of section seven of the said Act of 1948, that if provision for the payment of death grants corresponding to the provision therefor made by or under the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, is made by or under the law of a country or place outside Northern Ireland, the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council provide for extending (subject to modifications) the application of the said provisions of the said Act of 1948 to insurances where the funeral expenses in question are those, or the life or death in question is that, of a person who at the time of the proposal is ordinarily resident in that country or place, and for consequential amendments of provisions of that Act :
