AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said Order should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry of Finance, in pursuance of its powers under section two and sub-section (2) of section three of the Loans Guarantee and Borcowing Regulation Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, and of every other power it thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. Article 8 of the Control of Borrowing Order (Northern Ireland) 1947, shall have effect as if paragraph (3) thereof were omitted therefrom.
- 2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Control of Borrowing (Amendment of Exemption) Order (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall come into force on the 31st day of May, 1949.

## End of Emergency

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED 28TH JUNE, 1949, MADE UNDER SECTION SEVEN OF THE CHARTERED AND OTHER BODIES (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940.

## GRANVILLE

Whereas the Chartered and Other Bodies (Temporary Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") makes provision for promoting economy and efficiency in the carrying on under emergency conditions of the work of certain chartered and other bodies; for enabling the Queen's University of Belfast to adapt itself to emergency conditions; and for purposes connected with the matters aforesaid:

And whereas the Chartered and Other Bodies (Temporary Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1941, extends the powers conferred by section two of the Act and amends section five of the Act:

AND WHEREAS sub-section (2) of section eight of the Act provides that the Act shall continue in force until the end of the period of the present emergency, and shall then expire except as respects things previously done or omitted to be done:

AND WHEREAS by section seven of the Act the period of the present emergency means the period beginning with the first day of September nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, and ending with such date as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council declare to be the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Act came to an end.

Now, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM SPENCER, EARL GRANVILLE, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Vice-Admiral, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in exercise of the power conferred upon me by section seven of the Act do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. It is hereby declared that the twenty-seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and forty-nine, is the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Act came to an end.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Chartered and Other Bodies (Temporary Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940 (End of Emergency) Order (Northern Ireland), 1949.
