THE BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) (No. 1) ORDER, 1949, DATED 13TH JUNE, 1949, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Baking

Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 1) Order, 1949 (a), (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.Bk. (89)") dated the 4th day of April, 1949, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to certain workers in relation to whom the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates ;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :—

1. As from the specified date Order N.I.Bk. (89) shall have effect subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 17th day of June, 1949. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 1) Order, 1949.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

#### SCHEDULE

STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN AREA A, THAT IS, IN ESTABLISHMENTS (OTHER THAN HOME BAKERIES) IN THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF THE CITY OF BELFAST AND IN DISTRICTS SITUATE WITHIN A RADIUS OF 15 STATUTE MILES THEREFROM
