(3) These Regulations shall be construed as one with the principal Regulations.

2. The principal Regulations shall have effect as if for Regulation 27 thereof there were substituted the following Regulation :—

“ 27. Superintendents may be remunerated by the school authorities at such rate per hour of necessary attendance as may be approved by the Ministry, but payments may not be made by a school authority to members of their own body.”

3. These Regulations shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Award of Scholarships to Persons engaged in Industry.

REGULATIONS, DATED 19TH JULY, 1949, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

1949. No. 121

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 112 and 120 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Trade Scholarships (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall be construed as one with the Trade Scholarships Regulations, 1943 (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Regulations ”).

2. The principal Regulations shall have effect subject to these Regulations.

3. At the end of Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations there shall be added the following :—

“ Provided that a higher amount may be prescribed which will be payable to a scholar who satisfies the Ministry that it is necessary for him to take up temporary residence in the neighbourhood of the College which he may attend for an approved course.”

4. For paragraph (2) of the Proviso to Regulation 7 there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

“(2) in the case of any other scholar the sum payable by the Ministry in respect of travelling expenses shall be such amount as it may approve, subject to the condition that the amount as approved together with the maintenance allowance payable under Regulation 5 shall not exceed the maximum amount of maintenance allowance which he would receive under that Regulation if the Ministry were satisfied that it was necessary for him to take up temporary residence in the neighbourhood of the College.”

5. These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st September, 1949.
