

Certificates of Fitness of Young Persons (Adaptation)

REGULATIONS, DATED 5TH AUGUST, 1949, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1949.

1949. No. 134

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, (a) and of all other powers in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Factories (Certificates of Fitness of Young Persons) (Adaptation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall come into force on the first day of September, 1949.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (b) applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2.—(1) Section 103 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, (c) as amended by section 1 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, (which relates to certificates of fitness for employment of young persons) shall apply to employment in any of the processes, work or operations mentioned in section 2 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, subject to the adaptation set out in the next following paragraph.

(2) For the purpose of reckoning the period after which a young person may not remain in an employment unless he has been examined by the Appointed Factory Doctor and certified by him to be fit therefor, a young person who is taken into an employment specified in the Schedule hereto shall, so long as he is employed by the same employer in an employment falling within the same part of that Schedule as the employment into which he was taken, be treated as remaining in the same employment.
