Certificates of Fitness of Young Persons (Prescribed Period).

Order, dated 5th August, 1949, made by the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance under Section 103 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, as amended by Section 1 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred by section 103 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1938, (a) as amended by section 1 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, (b) and of all other powers in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Factories (Certificates of Fitness of Young Persons) (Prescribed Period) Order (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall come into force on the first day of September, 1949.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, (c) applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.
- 2. The period after which a young person may not remain in an employment unless he has been examined by the Appointed Factory Doctor and certified fit for that employment is hereby prescribed as fourteen days.
