# Reckoning of Teaching Service

REGULATIONS, DATED 13TH AUGUST, 1949, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION EIGHT OF THE SUPERANNUATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

### 1949. No. 155

The Ministry of Finance, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (2) of section eight of the Superannuation Act (Northern Ireland), 1947 (a), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Superannuation (Reckoning of Teaching Service) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of August, 1949.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (b), as applied to Northern Ireland by the Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland), 1921 (c), shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. In these Regulations the expression "Superannuation Act, 1909" (d), means the Superannuation Act, 1909 as applied to the civil service by the Superannuation Act, 1921 (e).
- 3. For the purpose of section eight of the Superannuation Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, teaching service may be reckoned where an interval of not more than three months has elapsed between the termination of such service and the commencement of service as a civil servant, but where such interval exceeds a period of three months, such teaching service shall not be reckoned unless the Ministry of Finance in any exceptional case shall so determine. Where, between the termination of the teaching service and the commencement of service as a civil servant, a person is employed in the civil service in an unestablished capacity, the period of such employment may be disregarded in reckoning the interval of three months aforesaid.
- 4. The amount of any additional allowance payable under subsection (2) of Section one of the Superannuation Act, 1909, to a person to whom Section eight of the Superannuation Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, applies shall be reduced by a sum amounting to 1/240th of the

officer's retiring salary (as reckonable for superannuation purposes) in respect of each completed year of teaching service.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, DATED 25TH APRIL, 1949, MADE UNDER SECTION TWELVE OF THE TEACHERS' SALARIES AND SUPERANNUATION (WAR SERVICE) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND

#### GRANVILLE

Whereas by section twelve of the Teachers' Salaries and Superannuation (War Service) Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council declare the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Act came to an end:

Now, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM SPENCER, EARL GRANVILLE, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Vice-Admiral, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twelve of the Act, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Teachers' Salaries and Superannuation (War Service) Act (End of Emergency) Order (Northern Ireland), 1949.
- 2. It is hereby declared that the twentieth day of April One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine is the date on which the
