(b) after the words "Sulphonal; alkyl sulphonals" there shall be added the words "Tridione (3:5:5-trimethyloxazolidine-2:4-dione)."

11. In paragraph (1) of the Seventh Schedule to the said Regulations (which specifies the poisons the presence of which in certain types of medicine renders it obligatory to label the container of the medicine in a particular manner) the word "Allylisopropylacetylurea" shall be omitted.

12. After the Fourteenth Schedule to the said Regulations there shall be added the Fifteenth Schedule set out in the Schedule hereto.

13. These Regulations may be cited as the Poisons Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949, and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1949.

WHEREAS by section seven of the Water Supplies and Sewerage Act (Northern Ireland), 1945 (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") may make an Order providing for the formation, for the purposes of the Act, of any sanitary districts or parts thereof into a united district within the meaning of section twelve of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and that any such Order may contain such incidental, consequential and supplementary provisions as appear to the Ministry to be necessary or expedient:
