

THE BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) (NO. 4) ORDER, 1950, DATED 5TH JUNE, 1950, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the further amendment of the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 1) Order, 1949 (a) (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.Bk. (89)") dated the 4th day of April, 1949, as amended by the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 1) Order, 1949 (b) dated the 13th day of June, 1949, the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1949 (c) dated the 27th day of July, 1949, the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 5) Order, 1949 (d) dated the 24th day of November, 1949 and the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 1) Order, 1950 (e) dated the 3rd day of January, 1950 which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to certain workers in relation to whom the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

1. As from the specified date Order N.I.Bk. (89) as amended shall have effect subject to the further amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order. Statutory minimum remuneration.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 3rd day of July, 1950. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date. Commencement

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1950. Short title and interpretation.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland. 52 & 53 Vict. Ch. 63

SCHEDULE

STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN AREA A, THAT IS, IN ESTABLISHMENTS (OTHER THAN HOME BAKERIES) IN THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF THE CITY OF BELFAST AND IN DISTRICTS SITUATE WITHIN A RADIUS OF 15 STATUTE MILES THEREFROM.

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The Schedule to Order N.I. Bk. (89), as amended, shall be further amended as follows :—

Sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 1 of the said Schedule shall be revoked and the following new sub-paragraph inserted in lieu thereof—

DAY WORKERS

Where the working days of the normal working week commence after 6 a.m. and finish before 8-30 p.m.
