## THE BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGU-LATION (AMENDMENT) (No. 5) ORDER, 1950, DATED 5TH JUNE, 1950, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

#### 1950. No. 145

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the further amendment of the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1949 (a) (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.Bk. (90) ") dated the 4th day of April, 1949, as amended by the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1949 (b) dated the 13th day of June, 1949 and the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1950 (c) dated the 3rd day of January, 1950, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to certain workers in relation to whom the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates;

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :---

1. As from the specified date Order N.I.Bk. (90) as amended shall minimum rehave effect subject to the further amendments set out in the Schedule . muneration. to this Order.

> 2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 3rd day of July, 1950. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
