REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH MARCH, 1950, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, NORTHERN IRELAND, UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 43 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :---

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Milk and Meals Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on 10th April, 1950.

3. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Milk and Meals Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948.

4. The existing Regulations shall have effect as if for paragraph (2) (a) of Regulation 11 thereof there were substituted the following paragraph :---

"(2) (a) For a dinner supplied to a pupil the parent shall be charged an amount not exceeding by more than one penny the cost of the food supplied therein."

1. These Regulations may be cited as The Parliamentary Grants . (Local Education Authorities) Amending Regulations, 1950.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the date hereof.

3. The existing Regulations hereby amended are The Parliamentary Grants (Local Education Authorities) Regulations, 1948.

4. The existing Regulations shall have effect as if for Regulation 7 thereof there were substituted therefor :---

"7. For the purpose of determining the amount of grant payable under Regulation 6 of these Regulations there shall be deducted from the expenditure specified therein any sums received by the local education authority from parents as payment for school meals, and any other receipts which in the opinion of the
