REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND JUNE, 1951, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THE HEALTH SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948.

1951. No. 113

The Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 6 and 12 of the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Health Services (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951, and shall come into operation on the 1st July, 1951.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2. The Health Services (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948 (a) shall be amended as follows :—

(1) For paragraphs (1) and (2) of Regulation 8 there shall be substituted the following paragraphs :—

(1) If any person requires treatment immediately owing to an accident or other emergency it shall be the duty of any practitioner engaging in general medical services, who is summoned and is available or at whose surgery the person attends, to give any treatment immediately necessary unless a practitioner who is responsible for the person's treatment under these Regulations, or his deputy, is available.

(2) Where a person for whom treatment has been provided in an emergency is on the list of another practitioner the Board shall, when informed of the provision of such treatment, as soon as possible inform such practitioner.

(2) For paragraph (2) of Regulation 16 there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

(2) Any deletion resulting from a person's ceasing to be entitled to receive treatment from the practitioner on whose list his name appears shall take effect as from the date specified in the notice of deletion, which shall be a date (a) not earlier than that on which the person ceases to be so entitled and (b) not more than fourteen days earlier than the date of issue of the notice to the practitioner.

(3) In paragraph (3) of Regulation 24 there shall be substituted for the words " up to date " the words " at intervals not exceeding six months ".

(4) In paragraph (4) of Regulation 24 the words from " The Board shall also send " to the end of the paragraph shall be deleted.

(5) The following shall be added at the end of paragraph 18 of Part I of the First Schedule :—

A person remaining in a district for less than twenty-four hours shall be deemed not to be a temporary resident in that district within the meaning of this paragraph and a practitioner providing emergency treatment for such a person shall be paid therefor in accordance with the scale of fees set out in the last foregoing paragraph.

(6) For sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 26 of Part I of the First Schedule there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph :—

(b) the number of units to the credit of a practitioner to whom proviso (a) of this paragraph does not apply

shall, for the year ending 31st March, 1952, be calculated by adding together the number of units to his credit at the 31st March, 1951, and at 31st March, 1952, and dividing the total by two.

Medical Practices Compensation

REGULATIONS, DATED 28TH FEBRUARY, 1951, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THE HEALTH SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948.

1951. No. 32

The Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 8 and 60 of the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Health Services (Medical Practices Compensation) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951.

(2) In these Regulations the expression "Principal Regulations" means the Health Services (Medical Practices Compensation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950 (a).

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations in like manner as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2.—(1) Regulation 3 (3) of the Principal Regulations shall have effect as though there were substituted for the words "28th February, 1951" the words "31st March, 1951".

(2) There shall be added at the end of Regulation 14 of the Principal Regulations the following sentence:—"The Ministry may pay to the nominated members of the Committee such fees and expenses as the Ministry, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, may determine."
