WHEREAS the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the provisions of section

8 of the Erne Drainage and Development Act (Northern Ireland), 1950 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"); duly prepared a Scheme entitled the Erne Development Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") for giving effect to the provisions of the Agreement made on the 4th day of September, 1950, between the Ministry and the Electricity Supply Board, Dublin, pursuant to the Act;
