REGULATIONS, DATED 23RD APRIL, 1951, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER THE HEALTH SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948.

1951. No. 62

The Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections six, twelve, and thirteen of the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, hereby makes the following Regulations :--

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Health Services (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951, and shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1951.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2. The Health Services (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948 (a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations") shall be amended as follows :---

(1) The lists of prescribed appliances and chemical reagents contained in Parts I and II of the Schedule to these Regulations shall be substituted for the corresponding lists in the Second Schedule to the Principal Regulations as amended by Regulation 5 of the Health Services (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949 (b).

(2) For sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 3 of Part I of the Third Schedule to the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph :---

(a) S. R. & O. (N.I.) 1948 No. 147. (b) S. R. & O. (N.I.) 1949. No. 143.

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" (2) Any drug so supplied which is included in the Drug Tariff shall be of a grade or quality not lower than the grade or quality specified therein and any drug not so included shall be of a grade or quality ordinarily used for medical purposes. Each appliance so supplied shall conform to any specification which may, from time to time, be included in the Drug Tariff in respect of that appliance."
