

(3) These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April, 1952.

2. For Regulation 27 of the Electoral (Parliamentary Elections) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1946, there shall be substituted the following Regulation —

“ 27. For the purposes of section twenty-five of the Elections and Franchise Act (Northern Ireland), 1946 (Reprint to 1948), the document of identity to be produced for the inspection of the Presiding Officer by a person applying for a ballot paper shall be —

- (a) a medical card issued by the Northern Ireland General Health Services Board ; or
- (b) a valid British passport ; or
- (c) a travel identity card ; or
- (d) a motor driver's licence issued in Northern Ireland ; or
- (e) a document of identity issued by a Head or other Constable of the R.U.C. in charge of a Station ;

which bears a description or particulars of the holder sufficient to identify him with the entry in the Register in respect of which he is applying to vote.”

### **Registration Expenses and Remuneration of Officers**

REGULATIONS, DATED 7TH FEBRUARY, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION THIRTY-NINE OF THE ELECTIONS AND FRANCHISE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946 (REPRINT TO 1948).

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section Thirty-nine of the Elections and Franchise Act (Northern Ireland), 1946 (Reprint to 1948) (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1946”), and of all other powers in that behalf thereunto enabling the Ministry, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. The several officers mentioned in the First Schedule to these Regulations shall be entitled to receive as remuneration and as expenses for the performance of the registration duties imposed on them by or

under the provisions of the Act of 1946 in connection with the compilation and publication of the Register of Electors in the year 1952 the sums respectively set out in that behalf in the said Schedule.

2. The additional expenses, other than such expenses as are provided for in the First Schedule hereto, to be incurred by any Electoral Officer, whether as expenses of Deputy Electoral Officers or Revising Officers or their assistants, or in the employment of clerical assistance or in the form of any other miscellaneous costs, shall not exceed the amounts, respectively specified in that behalf in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

4. The Electoral (Registration Expenses) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951, are hereby revoked.

5. These Regulations may be cited as the Electoral (Registration Expenses) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952.

## EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING

### Advisory Committees

REGULATIONS, DATED 7TH MAY, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950.

1952. No. 78

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of section one of the Employment and Training Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations :—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Employment and Training (Advisory Committees) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, and shall come into operation forthwith.

(2) In these regulations—

“the Act” means the Employment and Training Act (Northern Ireland), 1950;

“the Ministry” means the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2. The Local Employment Committee Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1922, made under section two of the Labour Exchanges Act, 1909, and continued in force under sub-section (2) of section eleven of the Act are hereby revoked.

3. The Ministry shall appoint an Advisory Committee for the whole of Northern Ireland to be known as the Northern Ireland Advisory Committee and an Advisory Committee for each County and County Borough.
