

Grammar School Teachers : Salaries and Allowances

REGULATIONS, DATED 1ST JULY, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1951, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Grammar School (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) Amending Regulations, 1952.
2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Grammar School (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) Regulations, 1951 (a).
3. The rates of salary prescribed in Regulations 5 and 10 of the existing Regulations shall be increased by £40 per annum in the case of men and by £32 per annum in the case of women in respect of service given on and after 1st July, 1952.

Handicapped Pupils and Special Schools

REGULATIONS, DATED 24TH JULY, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1952, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 29, 30, 104 and 106 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Handicapped Pupils and Special Schools (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952.
- (2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1952.

2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Handicapped Pupils and Special Schools Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1948.

3. After Regulation 12 of the existing Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulation :—

12a.—(1) On each day on which a special school is open in accordance with the requirements of sub-paragraph (f) of Regulation 12 the school day shall, unless the Ministry otherwise approves, comprise :

- (a) at least three hours of secular instruction in the case of a pupil enrolled in a class composed mainly of pupils who, at the commencement of the school year, had not attained the age of 8 years ;
- (b) at least four hours of secular instruction in the case of a pupil enrolled in any other class.

Provided that, where the Medical Officer considers on medical grounds that it would be detrimental to a pupil to remain under instruction for three or four hours, as the case may be, the school authorities may reduce the period of attendance for such pupil.

(2) In the case of a pupil to whom the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of this Regulation applies the school day shall consist of two sessions separated by a period of not less than half-an-hour.
