Paper Box Wages Council

THE PAPER BOX WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION ORDER, 1952, DATED 25TH FEBRUARY, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 AND 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

1952. No. 38

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as “ the Ministry ”) has received from the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for fixing the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Council operates in substitution for the minimum remuneration fixed by the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages

Regulation Order, 1946 (a) dated the 16th day of December, 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.B. (36)") as amended by the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1951 (b) dated the 15th day of August, 1951, (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.B. (47)"), and for the amendment of the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1948 (c) dated the 19th day of April, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.B. (41)"), which specifies the holidays to be allowed and fixes the holiday remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Council operates ;

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—(1) As from the specified date the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the First Schedule to this Order shall be paid to the workers therein specified. Statutory minimum remuneration.

(2) Order N.I.B. (41) shall, as from the specified date, have effect subject to the amendments set out in the Second Schedule to this Order. Holidays and holiday remuneration.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 6th day of March, 1952. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date. Commencement.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1952. Short title, interpretation and revocation.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland. 52 & 53 Vict., Ch. 63.

(3) As from the specified date Order N.I.B. (36) and Order N.I.B. (47) are hereby revoked.

PARAGRAPH 15.

BOXES OF SIZES OTHER THAN THOSE INDICATED ABOVE.

For boxes of measurements other than those specifically indicated within the scales of sizes set out in paragraphs 10 to 14 of this Schedule the general minimum piece rates payable shall be determined by the product of the length and width of the box. Thus the piece rate payable for an oblong box, length 17" and width 9" (product 153), depth 3", would be the rate set out in paragraph 10 (3) for boxes of sizes over 12" × 12" (144) but not exceeding 16" × 10" (160). The product of the length and width of boxes is shown in brackets.

PARAGRAPH 16:

DETERMINATION OF SIZE OF BOX.

The size of a box shall be determined by the inside measurements taken at the top of the box.

OVERTIME

PARAGRAPH 17.

Overtime rates shall be payable as follows :—

A.—WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME WORK :

- (1) On any day other than Saturday, Sunday or a customary holiday.—
 For the first two hours worked in excess of 9 hours TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 Thereafter TIME-AND-A-HALF.
 Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require the worker's attendance on only five days a week, the said overtime rates of time-and-a-quarter and time-and-a-half shall be payable on four of those days only after 9½ hours and 11½ hours respectively, and on the remaining day only after 10 hours and 12 hours respectively, have been worked.
- (2) On Saturday, not being a customary holiday —
 For the first four hours worked in excess of 5 hours TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 Thereafter TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (3) On Sunday or a customary holiday —
 For all time worked DOUBLE TIME.
- (4) In any week —
 For all time worked in excess of 45 hours ... TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 except in so far as higher overtime rates may be payable under the provisions of sub-paragraph A (1), (2) or (3) of this paragraph.

B.—FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE WORK :

Female workers employed on piece work shall be entitled to receive, in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to piece rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the same amount of money as the appropriate piece work basis time rate applicable
 an amount equivalent to ONE-QUARTER, ONE-HALF, or the WHOLE of the appropriate piece work basis time rate

according as the overtime rate payable under the provisions of sub-paragraph A of this paragraph, if the worker had been employed on time work, would have been equivalent to time-and-a-quarter, time-and-a-half, or double time, respectively.

PARAGRAPH 18.

Overtime rates shall be payable in respect of all overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 45.

PARAGRAPH 19.

The expression "customary holiday" means —

- (a) Christmas Day, Boxing Day and the day following Boxing Day, Provided that —
- (1) where Christmas Day falls on a Thursday, Friday or Saturday, the Saturday in that week shall be treated as one of the customary holidays irrespective of whether the worker normally works on Saturday or not,
 - (2) where Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the customary holidays shall be Boxing Day and the next two following days,
 - (3) where the day following Boxing Day falls on a Sunday, that Sunday shall not be treated as one of the customary holidays, and a customary holiday shall be allowed to the worker on the Monday next following;
- (b) Easter Monday, Easter Tuesday and the Wednesday following the last-mentioned day; or
- (c) a day substituted by the employer for any one of the said days, being either a day recognised by local custom as a day of holiday in substitution for the said day, or a day agreed between the employer and the worker or his representative.

PARAGRAPH 20.

For the purpose of paragraph 17 the expressions time-and-a-quarter, time-and-a-half, and double time mean, respectively, one-and-a-quarter times, one-and-a-half times, and twice the amount of the minimum rate (*excluding any supplemental payment*) otherwise applicable.

GENERAL

DEFINITIONS

PARAGRAPH 21.

A MACHINE MINDER is a worker who is engaged in setting, adjusting and keeping running paper box machines, and in superintending the carrying through of all operations that can be performed in whole or in part by such machines.

PARAGRAPH 22.

A HEAD STOCK KEEPER is a worker who is in full charge of unmanufactured stock, of the receipt and distribution of unmanufactured stock, and of the keeping of records, and who either himself orders or passes through to the proper authority requisitions for further stock.

PARAGRAPH 23.

A LEARNER is a worker who —

- (a) in the case of a MALE LEARNER, has not completed the appropriate period of employment set out in paragraph 3 of this Schedule;
- (b) in the case of a FEMALE LEARNER, has not completed the appropriate period of employment set out in paragraph 6 of this Schedule; and
- (c) in the case of MALE and FEMALE LEARNERS —
 - (i) is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and
 - (ii) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Wages Council, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration, provided that the certification or registration of a learner shall become invalid if at any time during learnership the provisions set out in this Schedule relating thereto are not complied with, provided also that an employer may employ a learner on his or her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding eight weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter in the employment, the probation period shall be included in the period of learnership,

and provided further that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this paragraph, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if he or she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of his or her parent or guardian.

PARAGRAPH 24.

For the purpose of this Schedule "out-worker" means a worker who works in his own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

APPLICATION OF STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION TO
PIECE WORKERS

PARAGRAPH 25.

In the case of female workers employed on piece work operations for which no general minimum piece rates have been fixed each piece rate paid must be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, at least the same amount of money as the appropriate piece work basis time rate. In determining whether any piece rate satisfies the foregoing condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, juvenile and infirm workers.

EMPLOYMENT OF JUVENILE WORKERS ON PIECE WORK

PARAGRAPH 26.

An employer shall, in any case where a learner or other juvenile worker is employed on piece work during the first six months of his employment in the trade, be deemed to pay wages at less than the minimum rate unless he shows that such worker has received in respect of his employment on piece work in each week during that period, at least the same amount of money as such worker would have been entitled to receive if employed on time work.

An employer shall, in any case where any such worker is so employed at any time subsequent to the first six months of his employment in the trade, be deemed to pay wages at less than the minimum rate unless he shows that such worker has, in respect of his employment on piece work, been paid at piece rates which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker (not being a juvenile worker) at least the same amount of money as the appropriate piece work basis time rate.

WAITING TIME

PARAGRAPH 27.

- (1) A worker shall be entitled to payment of statutory minimum remuneration as aforesaid during all the time during which he is present on the premises of his employer unless he is so present either without his employer's consent, express or implied, or for some purpose unconnected with his work and other than that of waiting for work to be given to him to perform.
- (2) A piece worker shall during any time during which he is present as aforesaid and is not doing piece work be entitled to payment of the general minimum time rate applicable to the workers of the class to which he belongs.

Provisions (1) and (2) do not apply when —

- (a) a worker is present on his employer's premises by reason only of the fact that he is resident thereon, or
- (b) a worker is present on his employer's premises during normal meal times in a room or place in which no work is being done and is not waiting for work to be given to him to perform.

APPLICABILITY OF STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION

PARAGRAPH 28.

The statutory minimum remuneration aforesaid shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, to workers in relation to whom the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates, that is to say, workers employed in Northern Ireland in the trade specified in the Schedule to the

Trade Boards (Paper Box Trade, Northern Ireland) (Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings) Regulations, 1925, (a) dated 2nd March, 1925, namely :—

That branch of the Box Trade which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material.

SECOND SCHEDULE

HOLIDAYS AND HOLIDAY REMUNERATION

Order N.I.B. (41) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto :—

1. for sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 7 and for sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 9 there were substituted in each case the following sub-paragraph —

“(2) In relation to a piece worker Col. 3 of the last foregoing table shall have effect as if the words “ at the appropriate statutory minimum remuneration ” to the end of the column were deleted and there were inserted in lieu thereof the following words :—

(a) in the case of a male worker aged 21 years or over to whom a piece work basis time rate applies or of a female worker aged 18 years or over, at a time rate equal to the hourly piece work basis time rate applicable to the worker, or in the case of any other piece worker, at a time rate equal to the hourly general minimum time rate which would be applicable to the worker if he were a time worker ; and

(b) *any supplemental payment payable to the worker* ”.

2. in paragraph 13 the following were substituted for the definition of “ statutory minimum remuneration ” contained therein —

“ ‘ statutory minimum remuneration ’ means statutory minimum remuneration (other than holiday remuneration *but including any supplemental payment payable*) fixed by a wages regulation order made by the Ministry to give effect to proposals submitted to it by the Wages Council.”

THE PAPER BOX WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1952, DATED 1ST AUGUST, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as “ the Ministry ”) has received from the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1952 (b) (hereinafter in this Order referred to as “ Order N.I.B. (49)”) dated the 25th day of February, 1952, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates ;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :—
