1s. 6d. per hour."

Whereas the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the further amendment of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1951 (a) (hereinafter referred to as "Order N.I.H.H.G. (108)") dated the 8th day of August, 1951, as amended by the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1952 (b) dated the 30th day of January, 1952, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates;

Now, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1. As from the specified date Order N.I.H.H.G. (108) as amended Statutory shall have effect subject to the further amendments set out in the minimum reschedule to this Order.
- 2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the Commence-17th day of March, 1952. Provided that where, as respects any ment worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
