AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said Order should be varied as hereafter appearing in this Order.

Now, therefore, we, the Lords Justices of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of section seventeen of the Criminal Justice Administration Act, 1914, and of every other power us thereunto enabling, do hereby order and direct that as and from the 1st day of March, 1952, and notwithstanding any provision to the contrary contained in the aforesaid Order dated 15th day of August, 1944, all male persons sentenced to imprisonment by Courts of Assize, Commissions or Quarter Sessions or by a magistrate or magistrates, at Petty Sessions or otherwise, for terms exceeding three calendar months shall be committed to and imprisoned in Belfast Prison.

Provided that this Order shall be read as supplementary to the said Order of the 15th day of August, 1944, and the said last-mentioned Order, except as hereby altered, shall remain of full force and effect.

The Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 148 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878 (a), the Public Health Act, 1896 (b) and Section 143 of the Public Health Act, 1936 (c), as applied to Northern Ireland by virtue of the Public Health (Northern Ireland) (Extension of Enactments) Order, 1939 (d), and amended by virtue of the Ministries of Northern Ireland (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1945 (e), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Parrots (Prohibition of Import) (Revocation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1952.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (a), shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.
