Advisory Committees

REGULATIONS, DATED 7TH MAY, 1952, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950.

1952. No. 78

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of section one of the Employment and Training Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations :—

Citation,

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Employment and Training (Advisory Committees) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, and shall come into operation forthwith.

(2) In these regulations—

“the Act” means the Employment and Training Act (Northern Ireland), 1950;

“the Ministry” means the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance for Northern Ireland.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

2. The Local Employment Committee Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1922, made under section two of the Labour Exchanges Act, 1909, and continued in force under sub-section (2) of section eleven of the Act are hereby revoked.

3. The Ministry shall appoint an Advisory Committee for the whole of Northern Ireland to be known as the Northern Ireland Advisory Committee and an Advisory Committee for each County and County Borough.

4.—(1) The functions of the Northern Ireland Advisory Committee shall be to advise and assist the Ministry in connection with all matters arising under the Act in relation to Northern Ireland as a whole. Functions of Advisory Committees.

(2) The functions of the Advisory Committee for a county or county borough shall be to advise and assist the Ministry in connection with all matters arising under the Act in relation to that county or county borough.

5. The Northern Ireland Advisory Committee and the Advisory Committee for each county or county borough shall consist of members appointed by the Ministry being — Constitution and period of appointment.

(a) one person appointed to act as Chairman, and

(b) such number of other persons as the Ministry may determine.

6.—(1) Members of the Northern Ireland Advisory Committee or of an Advisory Committee for a county or county borough shall hold office for three years, except where the Ministry otherwise directs in any particular case.

(2) A member may resign his office by notice in writing under his hand given to the Ministry.

7.—(1) If a casual vacancy occurs amongst the members of an Advisory Committee the Ministry may appoint another person to fill the vacancy.

(2) The person so appointed shall hold office for the remainder of the period for which his predecessor, if he had continued to be a member, would have held office.

8. If, in the opinion of the Ministry, any member shall be incapable of continuing to act as a member of an Advisory Committee, the Ministry may terminate his appointment.

9. At every meeting of an Advisory Committee the Chairman shall preside or, in his absence, such other member of the committee shall preside as the members present at the meeting shall choose. Procedure at Meetings.

10. The quorum of an Advisory Committee shall be one-third of the whole number of the committee, in addition to the Chairman or the member authorised to preside in his absence.

11. An Advisory Committee shall have power to appoint sub-committees to consider any matters relating to the work of that committee.

12. If any member present at a meeting of an Advisory Committee or sub-committee dissents from a resolution passed by the majority of the members present, he shall have the right to have his views duly recorded and it shall be the duty of the Chairman to forward this record with a copy of the resolution to the Ministry.

13. Subject to these regulations, the procedure of any Advisory Committee or sub-committee thereof shall be such as may be determined from time to time by or with the approval of the Ministry or as may, in default of such determination, be agreed to by the Advisory Committee.

EXCHEQUER AND FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

Ulster Savings Certificates

First Issue

1952. No. 21

The Ministry of Finance in exercise of the powers vested in it by sub-section (1) of section sixteen of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and subject to the provisions of the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1922, as amended by any subsequent Regulations, hereby directs as follows :—

1. The currency of any Ulster Savings Certificate issued on or after the 1st April, 1922, and before the 1st December, 1923 (in this direction referred to as a "certificate of the First Issue"), shall be prolonged to a date thirty-nine years after the date of purchase of that certificate.
2. Interest shall be added after the thirtieth anniversary of the date of purchase and up to and including the thirty-ninth anniversary of that date at the rate of twopence in respect of each unit certificate of the First Issue for each completed period of three months.
3. On the death of any holder of a certificate of the First Issue after 30th day of November, 1943, the value of any such certificate held, including accrued interest, will be repaid to the legal personal representative, nominee, or other person entitled under the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations 1922, as amended by any subsequent Regulations.
