

Seed Material

2. The seed material to be used for the purpose of the preparation of *Brucella abortus* (Strain 19) vaccine shall be obtained from the Veterinary Laboratory, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, New Haw, Weybridge, Surrey.

Additional Test

3. The following additional test shall be applied to every batch of *Brucella abortus* (Strain 19) vaccine :

A dose of 1 millilitre of each batch of vaccine shall be injected intramuscularly into each of two healthy guinea pigs and the vaccine shall be treated as having passed the test if the injections do not produce death or serious symptoms in either guinea pig within ten days.

ORDER, DATED 7TH SEPTEMBER, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 23 OF THE BACON INDUSTRY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939.

WHEREAS the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") are the Board administering the Pigs Marketing Scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") as defined in section twenty-six of the Bacon Industry Act (Northern Ireland), 1939, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and amended by the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1939; the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1940; the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) No. 2) Order, 1940; and the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1948 :

AND WHEREAS paragraph two of the Schedule to the Act provides that any moneys standing to the credit of the fund established by the Scheme which are not required for the operation of the Scheme or otherwise for the purposes of the enactments applicable to the Scheme shall be applied for the benefit of the pig producing industry in such manner as the Ministry of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") may by order direct :

AND WHEREAS by section twenty-three of the Act it is provided that the Ministry may make regulations prescribing anything which is to be prescribed :

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said Schedule and section of the Act and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order, that is to say :—

1. The Board shall, in respect of the period 1st March, 1953, to 28th February, 1954, pay the sum of £400 to the Trustees of the

Agricultural Research Institute of Northern Ireland, Hillsborough, County Down, in respect of research in pig husbandry, and such payment shall be made within two months from the date of commencement of this Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Bacon Industry (Pig Husbandry Research Grant) Order (Northern Ireland), 1953 and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Bee Pest Prevention

REGULATIONS DATED 14TH DECEMBER, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE BEE PEST PREVENTION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

1953. No. 158

The Ministry of Agriculture by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Bee Pest Prevention Act (Northern Ireland) 1945, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations by way of amendment of the Bee Pest Prevention Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950 and 1952.

1. The Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, are hereby revoked as from the first day of February, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.

2. The fee payable under Regulation 10 of the Bee Pest Prevention Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950, shall be one shilling in respect of each stock.

3. These Regulations shall come into operation, on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953, and these Regulations and the Bee Pest Prevention Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950, shall be construed as one and may together be cited as the Bee Pest Prevention Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950 and 1953.
