

(2) If the Tribunal decides that any flax which is the subject of an appeal is not of a grade superior to that in which it was originally placed by or on behalf of the licence holder, the appeal fee shall be paid to the Exchequer.

9. The Ministry may pay out of moneys provided by Parliament such remuneration to the members of the Tribunal and such other expenses of the Tribunal as the Ministry may, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, determine.

## FISHERIES

### Foyle Area (Restriction of Netting Regulations), 1953

REGULATIONS, DATED THE 25TH MARCH, 1953, MADE BY THE FOYLE FISHERIES COMMISSION WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE OF THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT, 1952, AND OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1952.

The Foyle Fisheries Commission hereinafter referred to as "the Commission" in exercise of its powers under Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act, 1952 and Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland), 1952, hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Restriction of Netting) Regulations, 1953.

2. In these regulations —

references to a river or portion of a river shall be construed as including references to all tributaries of that river or all tributaries entering that portion of the river as the case may require,

the expression the "tidal waters of the River Foyle" means the tidal portions of the Lough and River Foyle from the confluence of the Rivers Mourne and Finn to the defined mouth of the River Foyle, and

the expression "the Carrickmore-Grange Foyle line" means a straight line drawn across the River Foyle from the downstream extremity of the left bank ferry quay in the townland of Carrickmore and County of Donegal to the downstream extremity of the right bank quay in the townland of Grange Foyle and County of Tyrone.

3.—(1) A person shall not use for the purpose of taking or with intent to take fish any net other than a landing net used solely as auxiliary to lawful angling with rod and line in the waters to which this article applies.

(2) This article applies to —

(a) that portion of the River Foyle between the Carrickmore-Grange Foyle line and a straight line drawn across the said River at right angles to its course through the northernmost point of the townland of Corkan Isle in the County of Donegal.

(b) that portion of the River Foyle known as the Back Water flowing to the east of the islands known as Corkan Isle and Islandmore and lying between straight lines drawn across the said River at right angles to its course through the northernmost point of the townland of Corkan Isle and the southernmost point of the townland of Islandmore, respectively.

(c) those portions of the Rivers Foyle, Finn and Mourne having for downstream limit a straight line drawn across the River Foyle at right angles to its course through the southernmost point of the townland of Islandmore in the County of Donegal and having for upstream limits

(i) in the River Finn a straight line drawn across the said river at right angles to its course from the northernmost point of the townland of Castletown in the Parish of Urney and County of Tyrone,

(ii) in the River Mourne the railway bridge known as Mourne Bridge in the townland of Townparks of Strabane and County of Tyrone,

(d) all that portion of the River Finn upstream of the road bridge known as Clady Bridge in the townlands of Cloghfin in the County of Donegal and Donnygowan in the County of Tyrone.

4.—(1) In the tidal waters of the River Foyle between the Carrickmore-Grange Foyle line and a straight line drawn across the River Foyle from the easternmost point in the townland of Drumnashear in the County of Donegal to the northernmost point in the townland of Magheramason in the County of Tyrone.

- (a) no draft net or two or more draft nets joined together of greater length than one hundred and sixty yards shall be used for the purpose of taking or with intent to take fish ;
- (b) draft nets shall not be used at a lesser distance from one another than two hundred yards.
- (2) In the tidal waters of the River Foyle above or upstream of the Carrickmore-Grange Foyle line, and in the tidal waters of the Rivers Finn and Mourne,
- (a) no draft net or two or more draft nets joined together of greater length than eighty-five yards shall be used for the purpose of taking or with intent to take fish ;
- (b) draft nets shall not be used at a lesser distance from one another than one hundred yards.
- (3) Nothing in this article shall be construed as authorising the use of any net whatsoever in any portion of the waters to which article 3 applies.

5. The Foyle Area (Restriction of Netting) Regulations (No. 2), 1952, are hereby revoked.

6. The Bye-law dated 28th February, 1871, by which the use of nets with meshes of one inch from knot to knot was permitted in Lough Foyle and the tideway of the River Foyle, is hereby revoked.
