

**HOUSE TO HOUSE CHARITABLE COLLECTIONS**

REGULATIONS MADE THE 13TH DAY OF APRIL, 1953, BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION FOUR OF THE HOUSE TO HOUSE CHARITABLE COLLECTIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1952.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section Four of the House to House Charitable Collections Act (Northern Ireland), 1952, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. For Regulation 8 of the House to House Charitable Collections Regulations, 1952, there shall be substituted the following Regulation :—

“ 8. No person under the age of sixteen years shall act or be authorised to act as a collector of money. Provided that where a collection is being carried out by a youth organisation approved by the Ministry of Home Affairs on behalf of a charitable body which has been exempted from the provisions of sub-section (2) of section one of the said Act, the said Ministry may, subject to such conditions as it may think fit, permit persons under the age of sixteen years but not under that of twelve years to act as collectors of money.”

2. These Regulations may be cited as the House to House Charitable Collections Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953, and shall have effect as and from the date hereof.
