

4. For Regulation 12 of the existing Regulations there shall be substituted the following :—

“ 12. A school shall be in operation during the school year for at least 200 days (exclusive of Sundays), of which not more than five days may be counted in any one calendar week from Sunday to Saturday, inclusive :

Provided that in exceptional circumstances, the Ministry may sanction a reduction in the minimum of 200 days.”

REGULATIONS DATED 30TH MARCH, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1952, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1953. No. 61

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as “ the Ministry ”), in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 104 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Primary Schools (General) (Amending) Regulations (Northern Ireland) (No. 2), 1953.

2. These Regulations shall take effect on 1st April, 1953.

3. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Primary Schools (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1949 (a), as amended by the Primary Schools (General) (Amending) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950 (b), 1952 (c) and 1953 (d).

4. As from the date on which these Regulations take effect the following paragraphs shall be added to Part I of the First Schedule to the existing Regulations :—

“ (f) National Service under the provisions of the National Service Act, 1948, or any amendments of that Act.

(g) Full-time teaching service, to such extent as the Ministry may determine, which was given in a school in the British Commonwealth and Empire prior to the

date on which the school was recognised or began to receive grants from the accredited education authority, provided that on the said date the teacher was employed in full-time teaching service in the school and possessed the qualifications required for recognition by the Ministry."

REGULATIONS DATED 30TH MARCH, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1952 AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1953. No. 55

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Primary Schools (Salaries and Allowances) Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953.

(2) These Regulations shall have effect from 1st April, 1953.

2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Primary Schools (Salaries and Allowances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1951, (a), as amended by the Primary Schools (Salaries and Allowances) Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, (b).

3.—(1) The proviso to paragraph (7) of Regulation 4 of the existing Regulations shall be amended by the deletion of the words "having more than 200 pupils on the rolls".
