

Educational Services Grants

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH MAY, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1947-1953, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1953. No. 73

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 104 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Educational Services (Northern Ireland Council for Orthopaedic Development) Grants Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the date hereof.

2. In accordance with arrangements approved by the Ministry of Finance, and subject to the requirements of these Regulations, the Ministry may make grants to the Northern Ireland Council for Orthopaedic Development (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in respect of expenditure incurred by the Council on services provided for children suffering from Cerebral Palsy.

3. The Council shall furnish to the Ministry each year a statement of accounts, duly certified by a qualified accountant, in respect of the Centre at which the aforesaid services are provided and such other information relating to the Centre as the Ministry may from time to time require.

4. The Centre shall be open to inspection by Inspectors or other officers of the Ministry at all reasonable times.

5. The Interpretation Act 1889, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.
