State Exhibitions

REGULATIONS, DATED 24TH JUNE, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDU-CATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1953. No. 91

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Section 77 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the State Exhibitions Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the date hereof.

2. The Ministry may award annually a number of Exhibitions tenable at Universities, to be known as State Exhibitions.

3. The number of Exhibitions awarded each year shall be determined by the Ministry.

4.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, Exhibitions, to be known as Group I Exhibitions, shall be awarded in order of merit on the results of the relevant examination in the group of subjects set out in Part I of the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Regulation, Exhibitions, to be known as Group II Exhibitions, shall be awarded in order of merit on the results of the relevant examination in the group of subjects set out in Part II of the Schedule to these regulations.

(3) An applicant may not obtain both a Group I Exhibition and a Group II Exhibition and a person who obtains any Exhibition may not at any time obtain another Exhibition.

(4) The Ministry may, at its discretion, draw up separate orders of merit for boys and girls.

(5) In this regulation the expression "relevant examination" means the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination held in the year in which application is made for an Exhibition.

State Exhibitions

5. To be eligible for the award of an Exhibition under Regulation 4 of these Regulations an applicant must, in the year in which the award is made, or in a previous year, have passed the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination.

6. In addition to the awards made under Regulation 4 of these Regulations the Ministry may award a number of Exhibitions on the results of the examinations held in the year of application for the General Certificate of Education of examining bodies in England and Wales or for the Scottish Leaving Certificate of the Scottish Education Department, if in the opinion of the Ministry the successful candidates have reached a standard of merit at least equivalent to that reached by successful candidates for awards under Regulation 4 :

Provided, however, that in 1954 and thereafter awards under this Regulation shall be made only to applicants in attendance at schools outside Northern Ireland.

7. To be eligible for the award of an Exhibition, an applicant must —

- (a) be ordinarily resident in Northern Ireland;
- (b) in 1953, be under 18 years of age on the first day of June, 1953; and
- (c) in 1954 or thereafter, be under 18 years of age on the first day of March in the year in which the award is made.

8.—(1) An Exhibition shall be tenable at a University and in respect of a course of study approved by the Ministry and shall, subject to the satisfactory conduct and progress of the holder, be continued for such time, not exceeding four years, as may be necessary to enable the holder to complete the course of study in respect of which the award is made.

(2) An applicant to whom an Exhibition has been awarded shall enter upon the approved course of study in the year in which the award is made or, if the Ministry so approves, in a later year.

9. An Exhibition shall be of the value of $\pounds 80$ per annum, and shall, subject to Regulation 8 (1) of these Regulations, be paid in such a manner as the Ministry may determine :

Provided, however, that if the holder of an Exhibition is for any reason absent from his course of study or fails to comply with the directions of the Ministry or the University Authorities, the Ministry may, at its discretion, reduce or withhold any payment normally due in respect of the Exhibition.

10. An application for the Exhibition must be made in such manner and by such date as the Ministry may determine.

11.—(1) The State Exhibitions Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950 (a), are hereby revoked.

(2) Notwithstanding the revocation of these Regulations the holder of a State Exhibition awarded under them may continue to hold the Exhibition as if the Regulations had not been revoked.

12. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

- Part I. The order of merit for Group I Exhibitions shall be determined by the addition of the marks obtained in four Advanced subjects of the examination including at least three of the following subjects : English Literature, Ancient History, Modern History, languages other than English.
- Part II. The order of merit for Group II Exhibitions shall be determined by the addition of the marks obtained in four Advanced subjects of the examination including at least three of the following subjects : Algebra and Trigonometry, Calculus, Geometry, Mechanics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany or Biology, Geography, Domestic Science, Geometrical Drawing.
