THE PAPER BOX WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND) WAGES REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1953, DATED 17TH JUNE, 1953, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945 (9 & 10 GEO. 6, CH. 21).

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as " the Ministry ") has received from the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for the amendment of the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1952 (a) (hereinafter in this Order referred to as " Order N.I.B. (49) ") dated the 25th day of February, 1952, as amended by the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1952 (b) (hereinafter in this Order referred to as " Order N.I.B. (51) ") dated 1st August, 1952, which fixes the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) operates ;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order :—

1. As from the specified date Order N.I.B. (49) shall have effect subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order, and as from that date Order N.I.B. (51) is hereby revoked.

2. In this Order the expression " the specified date " means the 29th day of June, 1953. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the

wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

- 3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1953. Short title and interpretation. 52 & 53 Vict., Ch. 63.
- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

WHEREAS the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Readymade and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) wages regulation proposals for fixing the minimum remuneration to be paid to the workers in relation to whom the Council operates in substitution for the minimum remuneration fixed by the Readymade and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1951 (a) dated the 25th day of April, 1951, (hereinafter in this Order referred to as "Order N.I.T.R.W. (36)");

NOW, THEREFORE, the Ministry by virtue of section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and of every other power in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

1. As from the specified date the statutory minimum remuneration set out in the Schedule to this Order shall be paid to the workers therein specified.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 7th day of April, 1953. Provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Readymade and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1953.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

(3) As from the specified date Order N.I.T.R.W. (36) is hereby revoked.
