Educational Services Grants

REGULATIONS DATED 6TH APRIL, 1954, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1953, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1954. No. 47

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 104 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Educational Services (National Sea Training Schools) Grants Regulations, 1954.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the date hereof.

2. In accordance with arrangements approved by the Ministry of Finance and subject to the requirements of these Regulations the Ministry may make grants to the Management Committee of the National Sea Training Schools (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") in respect of expenditure incurred by the Committee on services provided in connection with the National Sea Training School (Belfast) (hereinafter referred to as "the School") for the instruction of serving seamen: provided that—

- (i) the Committee shall furnish to the Ministry a statement of accounts for each year ending 31st July (hereinafter referred to as "the school year") duly certified by a qualified accountant and such other information in respect of the School as the Ministry may from time to time require; and
- (ii) the School shall be open to inspection by Inspectors or other officers of the Ministry at all reasonable times.

3. The amount of grant to be paid to the Committee each school year shall be determined by the Ministry and shall not exceed an amount equal to one-half of the expenditure of the Committee as approved by the Ministry and instalments of grant may be paid during each year without prejudice to subsequent adjustments.

4. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

Institutions of Further Education: Teachers' Salaries and Allowances

REGULATIONS, DATED 1ST APRIL, 1954, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1953, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

1954. No. 54

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Institutions of Further Education (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) Regulations, 1954.

(2) These Regulations shall take effect as from 1st April, 1954.

2. The Institutions of Further Education (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) Regulations, 1951 (a), and the Institutions of Further Education (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) Amending Regulations, 1952 (b), are hereby revoked as from 1st April, 1954.

3. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

"approved" means approved by the Ministry for the purposes to which the context relates;

"recognised" means recognised by the Ministry for the purposes of these Regulations;

"qualified teacher" means a teacher who has been granted recognition under the Further Education (Grant Conditions) Regulations, 1948, as from time to time amended, and the expression "unqualified teacher" shall be construed accordingly.

Other expressions which have meanings assigned to them by the Further Education (Grant Conditions) Regulations, 1948, as from time to time amended, shall have the same respective meanings for the purposes of these Regulations.
