The Ministry of Health and Local Government, in exercise of
 the powers conferred upon it by sections twenty-seven, twenty-
 seven B, twenty-seven C and twenty-eight of the Public Health
 and Local Government (Administrative Provisions) Act
 (Northern Ireland), 1946, hereby makes the following
 regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Local Government
 (Allowances to Members) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern
 Ireland), 1956, and shall be deemed to have had effect from the
 First day of April, 1956.

2. The Second Schedule to the Local Government (Allowances
 to Members) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1955(a), shall be
 amended as follows:—

(a) S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1955 No. 183.

- (a) in paragraph 1(1)(a)(ii), for the figures "10s." there shall be substituted the figures "12s.";
- (b) in paragraph 1(1)(b)(i), for the figures "35s. 6d." there shall be substituted the figures "36s. 6d."; and
- (c) in paragraph 1(1)(b)(ii), for the figures "42s." there shall be substituted the figures "48s. 6d."

MALONE AND WHITEABBEY TRAINING SCHOOLS

ORDER, DATED 28TH SEPTEMBER, 1956, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION EIGHTEEN OF THE MALONE AND WHITEABBEY TRAINING SCHOOLS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1956.

I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE TERENCE O'NEILL, D.L., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section eighteen of the Malone and Whiteabbey Training Schools Act (Northern Ireland), 1956, and of every other power me thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Malone and Whiteabbey Training Schools (Supplementary Provisions) Order (Northern Ireland), 1956.

(2) In this Order—

“the Act” means the Malone and Whiteabbey Training Schools Act (Northern Ireland), 1956;

“the Ministry” means the Ministry of Home Affairs;

“the Council” means the Council of the County Borough of Belfast;

“appointed day” means the 1st October, 1956;

“the Board” means the Malone and Whiteabbey Training Schools Management Board.

2. There shall be transferred to the Board as from the appointed day in addition to such supplies, furniture, fittings and equipment which vest in the Board by virtue of Section seven of the Act, any other personal property in or upon the Malone, Whiteabbey and Balmoral Training Schools, which immediately before that day belonged either to the Ministry or the Council, and on and after that day the Board shall, to the exclusion of the Ministry and the Council, have all such rights and be subject to all such liabilities in respect thereof, as the Ministry or the Council had or to which the Ministry or the Council were subject immediately before that day.
