

death of any person who has been employed as aforesaid has resulted from byssinosis and the disease was due to the nature of that employment, that person shall be treated for the purposes of Part IV of the Act (which relates to extension of insurance to diseases) and of the principal regulations, as amended, as if these regulations had been in force at the date of death, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) no benefit shall be payable in respect of the death of that person—

(i) by way of pension or allowance for any period before the said date on which these regulations come into operation;

(ii) by way of gratuity, on a claim made by or on behalf of any other person who has died before that date or to the widow of the deceased if she has remarried before that date:

Provided that a person who would be entitled to any benefit but for the operation of this sub-paragraph shall (except as provided in the next succeeding sub-paragraph) be treated as if he were entitled thereto for the purposes of any rights or obligations under the Act (whether of himself or any other person) which depend on his being so entitled other than the right to payment of that benefit:

(b) in applying, in respect of the death of that person, the provisions of the Fourth Schedule to the Act (which limit benefit payable in respect of any death) any person who has died before the said date on which these regulations come into operation shall be disregarded.

Widow's Benefit and Miscellaneous Provisions

REGULATIONS, DATED 21ST AUGUST, 1956, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (INDUSTRIAL INJURIES) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946 TO 1956.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of powers conferred by section 19(3)(d) of the National Insurance

(Industrial Injuries) Act (Northern Ireland), 1946 (a), as amended by section 2 of the Family Allowances and National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1956 (b), and by section 9 of the Family Allowances and National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1952 (c), as applied by section 7 of the said Act of 1956, and in exercise of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) (Widow's Benefit and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1956, and shall come into operation on the 21st August, 1956.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“the principal Act” means the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) Act (Northern Ireland), 1946;

“the Act of 1952” means the Family Allowances and National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1952;

“the Act of 1956” means the Family Allowances and National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1956.

Condition of entitlement to widow's death benefit in certain cases

2. As from the 21st August, 1956, paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section 19 of the principal Act, as amended by section 2 of the Act of 1956, (which subsection provides a higher weekly rate of death benefit for widows in certain specified cases and a lower rate in other cases) shall, in its application to awards of death benefit for widows under the principal Act, have effect subject—

(a) to the exception that a widow shall not be entitled to death benefit at the higher weekly rate by virtue of the said paragraph (d) in respect of a child who is for the time being not included in her family, unless that child cannot, by reason of the provisions of subsection (3) of section 24 of the Family Allowances Act (Northern Ireland), 1945 (d) (which subsection makes it a condition of a child's being treated as a member of any family that the child is in Northern Ireland), be treated as a member of any family; and

(b) to the condition that no payment of benefit shall be made thereunder in respect of a child who immediately before the 24th July, 1956 (being the date of the passing of the Act of 1956), could not be treated as a member of any family by reason of the provisions of the said subsection (3), unless a claim for such benefit has been made on or after the said 24th July, in accordance with the requirements of the principal Act.

Provisions as to claims

3. Any case in which, under the provisions of subsection (5) of section 7 of the Act of 1956 (which section relates to the

appointed day and transitional provisions) or of paragraph (b) of regulation 2 of these regulations, no payment of benefit can be made under the principal Act unless a claim therefor has been made after the passing of the Act of 1956, shall be excepted from the operation of subsection (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1952 (which relates to the effect of certain awards under the principal Act) by virtue of subsection (6) of the said section 7.

The Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of Section Three of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, as amended by the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, and the Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1955, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Preliminary

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations, 1956, and shall come into operation on the 1st August, 1956.

(2) In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires:—

Words importing the singular number shall include the plural number.

Words importing the plural number shall include the singular number, and words importing the masculine shall include the feminine.
