The Importation of Carnation Cuttings

ORDER, DATED 8TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1956, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1877 TO 1934.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts (Northern Ireland), 1877 to 1934(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, orders, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Citation and Commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Importation of Carnation Cuttings (Northern Ireland) Order, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Importation of Plants (Northern Ireland) Order, 1955(b), (hereinafter called “the principal Order”).

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of October, 1956.

Additional Restrictions on the Importation of Carnation Cuttings

2. In addition to the prohibitions and requirements imposed by Articles 6 and 7 of the principal Order, the landing in Northern Ireland of cuttings of carnation plants is prohibited unless either—

- (a) the plants (hereinafter called “the said plants”) from which the cuttings were taken and the plants from which the said plants were immediately derived were tested and were found to be free from bacterial wilts caused by *Pseudomonas caryophylli*, *Erwinia* sp. or other similar organisms, or
- (b) bacterial wilts caused by *Pseudomonas caryophylli*, *Erwinia* sp. or other similar organisms are not known to be established anywhere in the country in which the said plants were grown.
