

**The General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council
(Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1956**

Whereas the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland) the wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Ministry by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect on and from the specified date, and as from the date immediately preceding the specified date the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1955(b), shall cease to have effect.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 12th day of April, 1956, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

3. This Order may be cited as the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1956.

Whereas the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) the wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Ministry by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect on and from the specified date and as from the date immediately preceding the specified date the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation Order, 1947(b) shall cease to have effect.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 28th day of March, 1956, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

3. This Order may be cited as the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 1) Order, 1956.
