The Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957 increase the registration fee from 1/- to 1/3d per stock and revise the values of bees and appliances in movable-comb hives for compensation purposes.

REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND JULY, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

The Ministry of Health and Local Government (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers vested in it by section eighteen of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Belfast County Borough Council (City Surveyor's Staff Qualifications) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957.
- 2. A person shall not be qualified to be appointed to any of the offices in the City Surveyor's Department of the City and County Borough of Belfast as specified in the Schedule to these Regulations unless:

- (a) he possesses at least the qualifications set forth in that Schedule in relation to any particular post;
- (b) he has had adequate and suitable experience and has shown capacity in the practice of his profession;
- (c) he produces satisfactory evidence that his health and character are good;
- (d) he is a natural born British subject and is the son of a father also a natural born British subject:
- (e) he has, during the whole of the period of five years ending on the date of his appointment, been resident in the United Kingdom.
- 3. The Ministry may from time to time assent to any departure from the provisions of these Regulations, if, in its opinion, the adoption of such a course is desirable.
- The Belfast County Borough Council (Engineers' Qualifications) Order, 1940(a), the Belfast County Borough Council (City Survevor's Staff Qualifications) Order (Northern Ireland), 1941(b), and the Belfast County Borough Council (City Surveyor's Staff Qualifications) (Amendment) Order, (Northern Ireland), 1951(c), are hereby revoked.
